- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state treasurer;
- 2 to amend and reenact subsection 1 of the new section to chapter 5-01 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code as created by section 1 of House Bill No. 1404, as approved by the fifty-seventh
- 4 legislative assembly, and sections 54-11-13 and 54-27-08 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 5 relating to issuance of farm winery licenses, the salary of the state treasurer, and the signing of
- 6 warrants by electronic means; and to provide legislative intent to prohibit payment of national
- 7 association of state treasurers-related activities.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
10	funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in
11	the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to the state treasurer for the purpose of
12	defraying the expenses of the state treasurer, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and
13	ending June 30, 2003, as follows:

15	Operating expenses	106,036

16 Equipment 2,000

17 In lieu of tax payments <u>1,932,419</u>

18 Total general fund appropriation \$2,626,334

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of the new section to chapter 5-01 of the
North Dakota Century Code as created by section 1 of House Bill No. 1404, as approved by the
fifty-seventh legislative assembly, is amended and reenacted as follows:

 The state treasurer tax commissioner may issue a farm winery license to the owner or operator of a farm winery located within this state to produce table or sparkling wines. A farm winery must be operated by the owner of a North Dakota

1 farm and produce table or sparkling wines from grapes, grape juice, other fruit 2 bases, or honey with a majority of the ingredients by volume, excluding water, 3 grown and produced in this state by the farm winery. Licenses may be issued and 4 renewed for an annual fee of fifty dollars, which is in lieu of all other license fees 5 required by this title. 6 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 54-11-13 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 7 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 8 **54-11-13.** Salary of state treasurer. The annual salary of the state treasurer is 9 fifty-eight sixty-two thousand two nine hundred sixty-two seventy-four dollars through June 30, 10 2000 2002, fifty nine thousand four hundred twenty eight dollars through December 31, 2000, 11 and sixty-one sixty-four thousand one two hundred forty-two thirty-three dollars thereafter. 12 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-27-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 54-27-08. How moneys paid from state treasury - Warrants - When not necessary. 15 Except as otherwise provided, moneys may be paid from the state treasury only upon the 16 warrant or order prepared by the office of management and budget drawn on the state 17 treasurer. The state auditor shall recommend a form for order and warrant-check of the state 18 government which must conform, so far as consistent with statutory requirements, to approved 19 banking practice in order to facilitate handling of such instruments by banks and other 20 depositories. When such an order and warrant-check is signed by the state auditor, the state 21 treasurer shall accept the order or warrant with his the treasurer's signature, making the order 22 and warrant-check negotiable. No warrant upon the treasurer may be delivered or mailed to 23 the payee or his the payee's agent or representative until the warrant has been signed by the 24 treasurer and entered on the treasurer's books as a check drawn on a bank depository. A 25 record must be maintained specifying upon what fund or from what apportionment each warrant 26 is to be paid. The state treasurer may redeem outstanding bonds or pay interest on bonds 27 when due without the warrant of the office of management and budget, retaining the bond or 28 interest coupon as his a voucher for the payment until the next succeeding settlement. With 29 respect to electronic records and electronic signatures, the state treasurer shall utilize the 30 services provided by the information technology department.

- 1 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT PAYMENT OF NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF
- 2 STATE TREASURERS-RELATED ACTIVITIES. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that
- 3 the state treasurer be prohibited from using state funds for activities related to the national
- 4 association of state treasurers for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30,
- 5 2003.
