**ENGROSSED HOUSE CONCURRENT  
RESOLUTION NO. 3064**

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study workers' compensation fraud  
2 by employers, employees, attorneys, health care providers, and rehabilitation service providers  
3 in order to identify the financial impact of such fraud on the North Dakota workers'  
4 compensation fund, the most appropriate method of addressing such fraud, and the cost of  
5 addressing such fraud.

6 **WHEREAS**, nationally, workers compensation bureaus estimate that up to one-fourth of  
7 workers' compensation cases involve fraud by an employer, involved professional such as a  
8 physician or attorney, or an injured worker; and

9 **WHEREAS**, workers' compensation fraud results in increases in employer premiums  
10 and methods employers use to offset these premium increases include reduced employee  
11 benefits such as lower or no pay raises and reduced health insurance coverage; and

12 **WHEREAS**, the Legislative Assembly recognized the impact of fraud and enacted  
13 legislation in 1995 to create a workers' compensation fraud unit; and

14 **WHEREAS**, in 1999 the Legislative Assembly appropriated \$623,928 to workers'  
15 compensation for the fraud unit and the unit expects to recover \$7,752,091 during the  
16 1999-2001 biennium;

17 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES**  
18 **OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:**

19 That the Legislative Council study workers' compensation fraud by employers,  
20 employees, attorneys, health care providers, and rehabilitation service providers in order to  
21 identify the financial impact of such fraud on the North Dakota workers' compensation fund, the  
22 most appropriate method of addressing such fraud, and the cost of addressing such fraud; and

23 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Council report its findings and  
24 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to  
25 the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly.
