The Senate has not yet determined its state employee salary and health insurance adjustment policy. This policy will be decided at a later date, will affect all agencies uniformly and consistently, and will result in agency appropriation bills being adjusted accordingly.

When the hours flown exceed thirty-five hours in the twelve-month period, the aircraft is presumed not to be a demonstration aircraft and the aircraft excise tax must be remitted to the aeronautics commission under chapter 57-40.5 unless upon satisfactory proof the aeronautics commission determines the aircraft is used exclusively for demonstration purposes."
