TIM DAWSON: L.C.: This bill extends the life of the Regulatory Reform Review Commission between 2003-2005.

**REP. MARY EKSTROM:** How often do they meet?

TIM DAWSON: L.C.: 3 times in interim.

REP. DALE SEVERSON: Wasn't there an issue that prompted them to meet?

TIM DAWSON: L.C.: The chairman sent out letters to all interested parties and asked if there were issues that they wanted discussed. When the letters came back, we looked at what the PSC wanted in the previous bill a we looked at universal service. Before that the Commission was established to review the deregulation of telecommunications in the state which began in 1989.

REP. DALE SEVERSON: The Quest authority to go into long distance, is that part of the reason they want to continue?

TIM DAWSON: L.C.: No, it would be purely that universal service.

REP. MATTHEW KLEIN: With the changes, it wouldn't hurt to have someone accountable for it.

### **TESTIMONY**

Chairman Keiser and members of the House IBL Committee. Good morning, my name is Tony Clark, I am a state PSC Commissioner, and am the holder of the Commission's telecommunication portfolio. The bill before you is a product of the Regulatory Reform Review Commission, a statutory committee of which I am a member along with four state legislators.

The testimony I am presenting is on behalf of the PSC and is essentially neutral on the bill before you. The bill, as proposed by the RRRC, simply extends the life of the RRRC, which has been sunsetted in law.

The PSC believes the RRRC has served a useful purpose in the past and has valued the working relationship it has afforded us with members of the legislature.

The telecommunications industry is one of the more complex ones the legislature deals with, and for that reason, the legislature may find it helpful to have a group of legislators that develop an expertise in the field. For that reason, and because the telecommunications industry can change with little notice (especially if the FCC issues an order during an interim) you may decide the RRRC is a worthwhile investment for Legislative Council.

If however, the legislature chooses to handle telecom matters differently, perhaps as part of some other interim committee, we certainly are understanding of that. We believe the interim process can work either way, and are committed to working with all of you regardless.
