

As you can see the only correction made is to add the words "government entities" on lines 12 and 15. A situation arose concerning a Soil Conservation District that was transporting their no-till drill which they rent to various farmers within the district. For some reason, they stopped at a weigh station and were informed by the inspector on duty that they were in violation of the law because they did not have an over width permit and they were not exempt from that requirement because the district is not a "farmer, rancher, dealer or manufacturer." They were not cited as the inspector did use some common sense, but I believe it is preferable to correct this situation to eliminate problems and frustrations in the future.

The key word to focus on is in line 11, "husbandry". To allay any fears that this will open up over width exceptions to other types of equipment, it is essential to know that this bill pertains only to what most people know as farm equipment.
