Committee on Government and Veterans Affairs Testimony on House Bill 1064 Presented by Wayne Kindem, Job Service North Dakota January 23, 2003

A Chairman Klein and members of the committee my name is Wayne Kindem, Director of Administrative Services for Job Service North Dakota. I am here to testify in support of House Bill 1064.

House Bill 1064 transfers administration authority for the Job Service Retirement Plan (Plan) from Job Service North Dakota to the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) Board.

A goal of the Job Service Retirement Plan is to ensure the long-term timely and professional administration of the Plan. Job Services mission is to provide customer focused services to meet the current and emerging workforce needs of the state. We are not in the business of providing or administering employee benefit programs. Thus, it is a significant challenge to maintain the capacity and expertise to administer a retirement program. The PERS Board and the System staff have the expertise in retirement plan administration to meet our long-term goal. The primary mission of the PERS Board and system staff is to administer public employee benefit programs and as such maintains the expertise and capacity to provide effective administration of the Job Service North Dakota Retirement Plan.

Attached to my testimony is information that provides background about the Job Service Retirement Plan. I will not go through that information in detail but would like to highlight a few points about our plan and HB 1064 that I believe are relevant to your review of this legislation.

- First, the Job Service Plan would retain its separate identity. The Job Service Plan would remain an independent separately funded plan.
- Escond, the Plan is in solid financial condition. As of the last actuarial valuation, July 1,2002, the market value of plan assets were \$65.2 million with projected liabilities of \$59.9 million for a positive margin of over \$5 million or 9%.
- Third, the Plan is relatively small in numbers of participants, 81 active and inactive vested, 87 pensioners paid from plan assets and 122 pensioners who have annuities purchased from the Travelers for whom the Plan pays the COLA adjustments from 1993. The Plan was frozen to new entrants in 1980 so there are no new entrants to the Plan and the remaining current active participants will be retiring over the next 10 plus years.
- Fourth, the Plan has current investment guidelines (updated in July 2002) and uses the State Investment Board as its investment manager.
- Finally, the PERS Board has reviewed this proposal and has given its formal support to transferring the administration of the Job Service Retirement Plan to the Board. Also, the Legislative Council's Employee Benefits Programs Committee considered this transfer and gave its favorable recommendation.

In summary, the Plan is in excellent financial condition, it will remain a separately funded independent plan, but wishes to have the PERS Board expertise to administer the Plan for the long term.

JOB SERVICE RETIREMENT PLAN BACKGROUND

History, Current Operations, and Demographics

The Plan was established (NDCC Ch. 52-11) in 1960 at the encouragement of the United States Department of Labor (USDOL) since North Dakota did not have a retirement plan for public employees at that time. Job Service and the USDOL agreed in 1980 to enhancing plan benefits and freezing the Plan to new entrants as of October 1,1980 in part because by 1980 North Dakota had established a statewide public employees retirement program. Since October 1, 1980 all new hires at Job Service are participants in the NDPERS.

Until October 1, 1993 the Plan maintained a deposit administration fund with the Travelers and annuities were purchased for retirees from the Travelers. In October 1993 the Plan selected The North Dakota Investment Board to be the Plan investment manager. Retirees, after October 1, 1993, are paid their benefit from plan assets on a monthly basis. The Plan contracts with the Public Employees Retirement System to make the monthly payments. Annual cost- of-living adjustments, after October 1,1993, are paid from Plan assets for all Plan pensioners, including annuitants with the Travelers.

The Plan has an annual actuarial valuation, which is currently being performed by the Segal Co. The Plan, also, has a periodic asset-liability study to determine the optimal asset allocation to meet forecasted liabilities, review the Plan 'Investment Guidelines and Objectives', and make recommendations for changes to investment strategy, asset allocation and performance criteria. The most recent asset-liability study was completed in July 2002 and was used to update the Plan asset allocation.

The Plan Actuarial Valuation at July 1, 2002 shows 76 active participants, 5 inactive vested participants and 87 pensioners and beneficiaries. There are also 122 pensioners receiving payments from annuities purchased from the Travelers.

Funding Status

The Plan is fully funded. According to the most recent Actuarial Valuation (7-1-02) the actuarial value of assets is \$67,580,067 (market value is \$65,178,175) compared to \$59,851,477 actuarial present value of benefits. The financial status of the Plan is further strengthened by the USDOL commitment to resume amortizing the balance of the Plans' 'initial frozen unfunded liability' (IFUL) if the Plan were to go into an under funded status. Currently, the value of the unamortized IFUL is approximately \$12 million. The commitment of USDOL for the UFIL is included in the 'Compromise Agreement' between USDOL and Job Service North Dakota. The Plan could also trigger an employer normal cost contribution to Plan assets if the Plan were to enter an under funded status in the future.

Currently the Plan does not have an employer contribution for normal cost. Job service, as the employer, does contribute 4% of the active participants salary as a contribution 'on behalf of the employee' and the active participant pays 3% of their salary into plan assets.

Committee on Government and Veterans Affairs Testimony on House Bill 1064 Presented by Wayne Kindem, Job Service North Dakota February 28, 2003

Chairperson Krebsbach and members of the committee my name is Wayne Kindem, Director of Administrative Services for Job Service North Dakota. I am here to testify in support of House Bill 1064.

House Bill 1064 transfers administration authority for the Job Service Retirement Plan (Plan) from Job Service North Dakota to the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) Board.

A goal of the Job Service Retirement Plan is to ensure the long-term timely and professional administration of the Plan. Job Services mission is to provide customer focused services to meet the current and emerging workforce needs of the state. We are not in the business of providing or administering employee benefit programs. Thus, it is a significant challenge to maintain the capacity and expertise to administer a retirement program. The PERS Board and the System staff have the expertise in retirement plan administration to meet our long-term goal. The primary mission of the PERS Board and system staff is to administer public employee benefit programs and as such maintains the expertise and capacity to provide effective administration of the Job Service North Dakota Retirement Plan.

Attached to my testimony is information that provides background about the Job Service Retirement Plan. I will not go through that information in detail but would like to highlight a few points about our plan and HB 1064 that I believe are relevant to your review of this legislation.

First, the Job Service Plan would retain its separate identity. The Job Service Plan would remain an independent separately funded plan.

Second, the Plan is in solid financial condition. As of the last actuarial valuation, July 1,2002, the market value of plan assets were \$65.2 million with projected liabilities of \$59.9 million for a positive margin of over \$5 million or 9%.

Third, the Plan is relatively small in numbers of participants, 81 active and inactive vested, 87 pensioners paid from plan assets and 122 pensioners who have annuities purchased from the Travelers for whom the Plan pays the COLA adjustments from 1993. The Plan was frozen to new entrants in 1980 so there are no new entrants to the Plan and the remaining current active participants will be retiring over the next 10 plus years.

Fourth, the Plan has current investment guidelines (updated in July 2002) and uses the State Investment Board as its investment manager.

Finally, the PERS Board has reviewed this proposal and has given its formal support to transferring the administration of the Job Service Retirement Plan to the Board. Also, the Legislative Council's Employee Benefits Programs Committee considered this transfer and gave its favorable recommendation.

In summary, the Plan is in excellent financial condition, it will remain a separately funded independent plan, but wishes to have the PERS Board expertise to administer the Plan for the long term.
