

Rep. Boe asked why the word insurance is used, rather than compensation to which Edison replied that Workforce Safety Insurance capsulates the mission statement of the organization.

Edison said he would obtain figures and percentages as to how many claims are compensation (indemnity) and how many are benefits in response to a question from Rep. Ekstrom.

Tim Effertz appeared in opposition to the name change, for no other reason than he likes the solid sound of the word "bureau".

Sebold Vetter also came forth to testify in opposition to the proposed name change as he is "old fashioned, too."

BILL NO: HB 1065

SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: North Dakota Workers Compensation, together with its actuary, Glenn Evans of Pacific Actuariai Consultants, has reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

The proposed legislation provides for changing the name of the Workers Compensation Bureau to Workforce Safety & Insurance and declares it to be an emergency measure.

FISCAL IMPACT: Changing the agency's name will coincide with NDWC's move to their new building in May 2003. Costs associated with the name change will be minimal, as the change will occur in conjunction with NDWC's address change. No significant fiscal impact is auticipated.

My name is Chuck Peterson and I am Chairman of Jobbers Moving & Storage Co., Bismarck, ND. 2003 House Bill No.1065 Testimony Before the House Industry, Business, and Labor Committee Presented By: Brent J. Edison, Executive Director & CEO North Dakota Workers Compensation January 21, 2003

Mr. Chairman, Members of the Committee:

I am here to request your favorable consideration of 2003 House Bill No. 1065. This bill proposes to change the name of the Workers Compensation Bureau to Workforce Safety & Insurance. This bill comes to you with the unanimous support of the North Dakota Workers Compensation (NDWC) Board of Directors.

In May 2002, NDWC's Board of Directors participated in a strategic planning retreat to chart a course for the future of our organization. One of the ten strategic goals formulated at the retreat was "to operate with a new organizational name by mid-2003 to coincide with the change in location." A move to a new location provides NDWC with a window of opportunity to better define itself with a new name, at virtually no cost.

The board and staff are committed to promoting commerce in North Dakota and believe our rates and services can help attract new business. The change to Workforce Safety and Insurance will allow the organization to better promote North Dakota as a location for business opportunity. Workforce Safety and Insurance better represents to new businesses the efficiency and service currently provided than the more bureaucratic North Dakota Worker's Compensation Bureau.

Consistent with our proposed name change, workers compensation funds in the United States have changed their identities to better fit their operational focus. For example, Oklahoma State Insurance Fund is now CompSource Oklahoma, and Compensation Insurance Fund in Colorado is now Pinnacol Assurance.

NDWC was called Workmen's Compensation Bureau from 1919 until 1987, when the Legislative Assembly authorized the change to the existing name of Workers

In recognition of the innovations and improvements that distinguish today's organization from yesterday's bureaucracy, the term "bureau" has been eliminated internally since approximately January 2000. In January 2000, NDWC made its first attempt at recognizing its new identity by adopting the existing logo and tag line of "putting safety to work". This change reflected an increasing emphasis on workplace safety.



However, since the adoption of the current logo and tag line in 2000, technology has made possible significant advancements in the services provided to injured workers, employers, and medical providers. Online claims filing, online payroll reporting, and electronic medical bill submission are just a few advancements achieved in the past biennium.

In addition, NDWC continues to work toward other advancements such as the implementation of electronic bill payment, and the auto-adjudication of certain claims. Our new building on Century Avenue will provide an electronic link to our satellite offices throughout the state. The proposed name of Workforce Safety & Insurance is symbolic of our continued advancements and quest for excellence.

The development of the name Workforce Safety & Insurance was the result of considerable review and analysis. An organization-wide name contest was held in June 2002; focus groups to review the top five name suggestions were conducted with the assistance of the Department of Commerce; and business groups and a national media expert were consulted on an informal and cost-free basis.

Although numerous options were proposed, Workforce Safety and insurance was thought to best encompass and define the mission statement of our advancing organization. The proposed name will reflect a focus on safety in the workplace, a commitment to excellent customer service for both employers and employees, and an effective partnership with the medical community.

NDWC foresees nominal costs associated with the proposed name change. Because of the move to a new office location, new paper supplies bearing NDWC's address (brochures, manuals, and flyers) will be printed in any case to reflect the new address. The new name, logo and tag line can simply be changed in conjunction with the address change. The existing address and name found on any remaining inventory will be covered with a sticker bearing the new address and name.

2003 House Bill No.1065 Testimony Before the Senate Industry, Business, and Labor Committee Presented By: Brent J. Edison, Executive Director & CEO North Dakota Workers Compensation March 3, 2003

Mr. Chairman, Members of the Committee:

I am here to request your favorable consideration of 2003 House Bill No. 1065. This bill proposes to change the name of the Workers Compensation Bureau to Workforce Safety & Insurance. This bill comes to you with the unanimous support of the North Dakota Workers Compensation (NDWC) Board of Directors.

In May 2002, NDWC's Board of Directors participated in a strategic planning retreat to chart a course for the future of our organization. One of the ten strategic goals formulated at the retreat was "to operate with a new organizational name by mid-2003 to coincide with the change in location." A move to a new location provides NDWC with a window of opportunity to better define itself with a new name, at virtually no cost.

Consistent with our proposed name change, workers compensation funds in the United States have changed their identities to better fit their operational focus. For example, Oklahoma State Insurance Fund is now CompSource Oklahoma, and Compensation Insurance Fund in Colorado is now Pinnacol Assurance. Likewise, in North Dakota, other agencies and boards have proposed legislation to change their names, as well. (HB1183 and SB 2092).

North Dakota Workers Compensation was called Workmen's Compensation Bureau from 1919 until 1987, when the Legislative Assembly authorized the change to the existing name of Workers Compensation Bureau, bringing recognition to both male and female workers.

In recognition of the innovations and improvements that distinguish today's organization from yesterday's bureaucracy, the term "bureau" has been eliminated internally since



approximately January 2000. In January 2000, NDWC made its first attempt at recognizing its new identity by adopting the existing logo and tag line of "putting safety to work". This change reflected an increasing emphasis on workplace safety.



However, since the adoption of the current logo and tag line in 2000, technology has made possible significant advancements in the services provided to injured workers, employers, and medical providers. assistance of the Department of Commerce; and business groups and a national media expert were consulted on an informal and cost-free basis.

Although numerous options were proposed, Workforce Safety and Insurance was thought to best encompass and define the mission statement of our advancing organization. The proposed name will reflect a focus on safety in the workplace, a commitment to excellent customer service for both employers and employees, and an effective partnership with the medical community.

NDWC foresees nominal costs associated with the proposed name change. Because of the move to a new office location, new paper supplies bearing NDWC's address (brochures, manuals, and flyers) will be printed in any case to reflect the new address. The new name, logo and tag line can simply be changed in conjunction with the address change. The existing address and name found on any remaining inventory will be covered with a sticker bearing the new address and name.

The purpose of the project is to:
