

Chairman Klein and members of the committee, my name is Linda Belisle. I am the Director of Central Services Division of the Office of Management and Budget.

The intent of this bill is to remove the language referring to the Office of Management and Budget in Chapter 54-44.6-01. In 1999 when the Information Services Division of OMB became the state's Information Technology Department, the responsibilities for forms management were moved from OMB to the new ITD. In a subsequent section of this chapter, it states, "The chief information officer of the state shall serve as the state forms manager." The reference to OMB in the first section was inadvertently missed.

HB 1043 introduced by ITD also addresses this issue.
