Mr. Chairman and members of the committee:

My name is Anita Decker and I am the Director of the School Approval and Accreditation Division of the Department of Public Instruction. On behalf of the DPI, I am here to speak in support of HB 1078.

The Accreditation Unit of the Approval and Accreditation Division is responsible for issuing credentials to various school officials including superintendents, principals, counselors, and librarians. In doing so we require that applicants submit information to us, including social security numbers, addresses, and phone numbers. We use this information to contact credentialed individuals as well as to verify with the Education Standards and Practices Board that the individual seeking a credential has the appropriate education and has obtained the appropriate license.

Currently, information held by the ESPB can be protected from public disclosure under section 44-04-18.1 because they are a Board. Unfortunately, the same information in our offices cannot be protected because the statute does not exempt personal information held by a state agency that issues credentials. HB 1078 will allow us to protect the personal information of applicants for credentials from disclosure.
