

TESTIMONY BEFORE THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE February 3, 2003

House Bill No. 1100

Testimony - Presented by Ed Nagel, Jr. Director

Chairman DeKrey, members of the committee, my name is Ed Nagel. I am here to testify in support of House Bill No. 1100.

This bill proposes 4 changes to existing law that pertain to the State Auditor's duties and responsibilities.

The first change is on lines 7 through 10, of page 1. This change will allow the State Auditor and the Attorney General to use their discretion in determining what action should be taken, if any, when an agency refuses to obey a recommendation made by the State Auditor. The current language is inflexible and not practical if the recommendation made by the State Auditor does not require compliance with law.

The second change is on lines 16 through 21 on page 1. This change includes draft audit reports in the definition of working papers and would make draft audit reports exempt from the open records law. We are proposing an admendment to this bill which would remove the proposed changes on lines 16 through 21, since HB 1051 has been passed by the House and addresses the draft audit report issue.

The third change is in section 3, line 12 on page 2. The State Auditor does not prescribe any books specifically for the state treasurer to maintain. The State Auditor recommends that all agencies, including the State Treasurer, maintain appropriate records. The language in line 12 is outdated and serves no useful purpose.

The last change proposed by this bill is on line 20 of page 2. The change would make the director of the Office of Management and Budget responsible for determining the form for state warrants, instead of the State Auditor. This duty would be better handled by the Office of Management and Budget, than by the State Auditor's Office. The Office of Management and Budget works closely with the Information Technology Department and the Treasurer's Office. Also, the Office of Management and Budget is responsible for the state's accounting system which is tied into the checking writing process.

I urge your favorable consideration of this bill and I will answer any questions you have regarding the bill.

Chairman Traynor, members of the committee, my name is Ed Nagel. I'm here to testify in support of Engressed House Bill No. 1100.

This bill proposes 3 changes to existing law that pertain to the State Auditor's duties and responsibilities.

The first change is on page 1, lines 6 through 10. This change will allow the State Auditor and the Attorney General to use their discretion in determining what action should be taken, if any, when an agency refuses to obey a recommendation made by the State Auditor. The current language is inflexible and not practical when recommendations made by the State Auditor do not require compliance with law.

The second change is on line 19 of page 1. The State Auditor does not prescribe any books specifically for the State Treasurer to maintain. The State Auditor recommends that all agencies, including the State Treasurer, maintain appropriate records. The language in line 19 is outdated and serves no worthwhile purpose.

The last change proposed by this bill is page 2, line 4. The change would make the director of the Office of Management and Budget responsible for determining the form for state warrants, instead of the State Auditor. This duty would be better handled by the Office of Management and Budget, than by the State Auditor's Office. The Office of Management and Budget works closely with the Information Technology Department and the Treasurer's Office. Also, the Office of Management and Budget is responsible for the state's accounting system which is tied into the checking viriting process.

I urge your favorable consideration of this bill and I will answer any questions you have regarding the bill.

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SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-11-81. Duties of state treasurer. The state treasurer shall:

1. Receive and keep all the moneys belonging to the state not required to be received and kept by some other person.

2. Register the orders or certificates of the office of management and budget delivered to the state treasurer when moneys are paid or to be paid into the treasury.

3. Prepare a receipt for each deposit of money into the treasury. The receipt must show the amount, the source from which the money accrued, and the funds into which it is paid. The receipts must be numbered in order. Duplicates, if requested, must be delivered to the office of management and budget and the person paying money into the treasury.

4. Pay warrants drawn by the office of management and budget and signed by the state auditor out of the funds upon which they are drawn and in the order in which they are presented.

5. Keep an account of all moneys received and disbursed.

6. Keep separate accounts of the different funds.

Keep a record of all revenues and expenditures of state agencies and all moneys received and disbursed by the treasurer in accordance with the requirements of the state's central accounting system.

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Receive in payment of public dues the warrants drawn by the office of 1 2 management and budget and signed by the state auditor in conformity with law. 3 Redeem warrants drawn by the office of management and budget and signed by the state auditor in conformity with law, if there is money in the treasury 5 appropriated for that purpose. Report to the office of management and budget on the last day of each month the 6 amount disbursed for the redemption of bonds and the payment of warrants during 7 8 the month. The report must show: The date and number of each bond and warrant; The fund out of which each was paid; and 10 The balance in cash on hand in the treasury to the credit of each fund. 11 At the request of either house of the legislative assembly, or of any committee 12 thereof, give information in writing as to the condition of the treasury, or upon any 13 subject relating to the duties of office. 14 Submit a biennial report to the governor and the secretary of state in accordance 15 with section 54-06-04. In addition to any requirements established pursuant to 16 section 54-06-04, the report must show the exact balance in the treasury to the 17 credit of the state. The report also must show in detail the receipts and 18 disbursements, together with a summary thereof, the balances in the various funds 19 at the beginning and ending of the blennium, and also must show where the funds 20 of the state are deposited. It must be certified by the state treasurer and approved 21 22 by the governor. Authenticate with the official state seal of the state treasurer all writings and 23 papers issued from the treasurer's office. 24 Keep a book in which the state treasurer shall enter all warrants paid, giving the 25 name of the owner and the number and amount of each wurrant. 26 Keep and disburse all moneys belonging to the state in the manner provided by 27 28 law. Keep books of the state treasurer open at all times for the inspection of the 29

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governor, the state auditor, the commissioner of financial institutions, the office of

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management and budget, and any committee appointed to examine them by either house of the legislative assembly. Unless otherwise specified by law, credit all income earned on the deposit or investment of all state moneys to the state's general fund. This subsection does not apply to: Income earned on state moneys that are deposited or invested to the credit of the Industrial commission or any agency, utility, industry, enterprise, or business project operated, managed, controlled, or governed by the industrial commission. 10 Income earned by the Bank of North Dakota for its own account on state 11 moneys that are deposited in or invested with the Bank. 12 Income earned on college and university funds not deposited in the state 13 treasury. 14 Perform all other duties as are prescribed by law. 15 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 54-11-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 16 amended and reenacted as follows: 17

54-11-04. Records of state treasurer. The state treasurer shall keep the following

records

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- 1. A each back in which must be entered the amount of all moneys received or paid out, showing from whom received or to whom paid and on what account or fund.
- 2. A ledger in which must be kept an account with each fund.
- 3. A daily balance book in which must be shown the amount in state depositories and

- 25 These records must be disposed of in accordance with the procedures established pursuant to
- 26 chapter 54-46.
