TESTIMONY OF ROBERT BENNETT ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL

CONCERNING HOUSE BILL NO. 1111 BEFORE THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

As a result of action by the Legislative Assembly during the 2001 session, the criminal statutes relating to drug paraphemalia were moved from title 12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code to a new chapter in title 19; chapter 19-03.4.

Other statutory provisions were not amended to reflect this action and House Bill No. 1111 addresses those omissions.

Section 1 of the Bill amends subsection 3 of section 12-60-16.4 of the North Dakota Century Code to include misdeme and drug paraphernalia offenses within the criminal history record reporting requirements. All felony offenses and most misdemeanor offenses are reported to the Bureau of Criminal Investigation as a part of the criminal history record system. Prior to last session, all misdemeanor drug paraphernalia offenses were reported to the Bureau since those offenses were title 12.1 crimes. North Dakota Century Code sections 19-03.4-03, 19-03.4-04, and 19-03.4-06 impose class A misdemeanor penalties for their violation under certain circumstances. House Bill No. 1111 will include those crimes as reportable offenses to the Bureau.

Section 2 of the Bill amends the drug forfeiture provisions of subdivision g of subsection 1 of section 19-03.1-36 of the North Dakota Century Code to reflect the move of drug paraphernalia offenses from title 12.1 to chapter 19-03.4.

TESTIMONY OF ROBERT BENNETT ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL

CONCERNING HOUSE BILL NO. 1111 BEFORE THE SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

As a result of action by the Legislative Assembly during the 2001 session, the criminal statutes relating to drug paraphernalia were moved from title 12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code to a new chapter in title 19; chapter 19-03.4.

Other statutory provisions were not amended to reflect this action and House Bill No. 1111 addresses those omissions.

Section 1 of the House Bill No. 1111 amends subsection 3 of section 12-60-16.4 of the North Dakota Century Code to include misdemeanor drug paraphernalia offenses within the criminal history record reporting requirements. All felony offenses and most misdemeanor offenses are reported to the Bureau of Criminal Investigation as a part of the criminal history record system. Prior to last session, all misdemeanor drug paraphernalia offenses were reported to the Bureau since those offenses were title 12.1 crimes. North Dakota Century Code sections 19-03.4-03, 19-03.4-04, and 19-03.4-06 impose class A misdemeanor penalties for their violation under certain circumstances. House Bill No. 1111 will include those crimes as reportable offenses to the Bureau.
