Karen Romig Larson, Director of the Div. of Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services appeared in support of the bill with written testimony stating this bill is offered for 2 actions: The first is to repeal Chapter 23-27.1 of the NDCC relating to the licensing of addiction hospitals and the second is to create a new chapter, 50-31 and also proposed amendments of language changes which reflect current practice and definition of addiction treatment.

Questions of Ms. Larson by the committee consisted of, licensing programs not facilities, programs offered by individuals, confidentiality statement, statistical information on number of patients treated in a facility across the state, non identifiable statistics, suspending or revoking of licenses and if there was an appeal process.

Rep. Devlin noted that he was not at ease with the appeal process and wondered if language should be amended to include the appeal process they are using now. Because to him, it was very clear that you can just pull a license and they just start over.

Krista Andrews. Attorney for the Dept. or Health was called upon to the explain why they have the amendment for Chapter 23-16 and that was to make sure that all the cross references in other portions of the Century Code were updated to reflect that we moved this section from the Health Dept.'s chapter over to the Human Services chapter.

Ms. Larson also stated that we have in our rules adopted the ability to have what we have called deemed status so that we don't go in and just create another 2-3 days of very expensive time and this program has been accredited by the joint commission on accreditation for hospitals. We accept that accreditation as verification that they need licenses.

Ms. Larson was also called upon in regards to West Central Human Services to explain how the process works, who inspects them, who licenses and how the process will work if this bill were to pass.

Ms. Larson stated that nothing will change from how it has been operating.

Rep. Porter stated concerns with the Dept. basically licensing and inspecting themselves, and was wondering who have the oversight to make sure that the Dept. just isn't doing a 100 % job of the task assigned them.

<u>David Peske</u> of the North Dakota Medical Assoc. appeared in support of the amendments proposed by Ms. Larson, stating that the language she is deleting really addresses construction and renovation in facility issues.

No opposition to this bill.

Chairperson Price and members of the Committee: I am Karen Romig Larson, Director of the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. I am here today to testify in support of HB 1165.

This bill is offered to accomplish two actions. The first is to repeal Chapter 23-27.1 of North Dakota Century Code relating to the licensing of addiction hospitals. This chapter has existed since 1965, and is based on licensing when the former Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse it was a part of the ND Department of Health. The Division was transferred to the Department of Human Services when it was created in 1983, but the licensing statute has remained in Chapter 23.

The second action is to create a new chapter, 50-31. In creating that new chapter, we have also proposed language changes which reflect current practice and definition of addiction treatment.

In reviewing the bill, I have discovered an oversight in removing some of the language currently found in Chapter 23-17.1 as it pertains to a facility and construction. I offer an amendment to delete the reference to additions and construction found on page 2, lines 8, 9 and 10. The proposed amendment is attached.

Chairperson Lee and members of the Senate Human Services Committee: I am Karen Romig Larson, Director of the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. I am here today to testify in support of HB 1165.

This bill is offered to accomplish two actions. The first is to repeal Chapter 23-27.1 of North Dakota Century Code relating to the licensing of addiction hospitals. This chapter has existed since 1965, and is based on licensing when the former Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse was a part of the ND Department of Health. The Division was transferred to the Department of Human Services when it was created in 1983, but the licensing statute has remained in Chapter 23.

The second action is to create a new chapter on licensure, Chapter 50-31. In creating this new chapter, language changes have been made which reflect current practice and definitions of addiction treatment.

One amendment passed in the House removed language referring to facility construction, as licensure is currently geared to program and not facilities. A second amendment passed in the House added the right of the applicant or licensee to request an administrative hearing in the case of a suspension or revocation of a license.

Beyond the updated language, I believe the original intent of the licensure chapter remains virtually the same. I would be pleased to answer any questions you may have.
