Under the provisions of N.D.C.C. § 54-06-04(3), "a committee composed of the director of the state historical society, the state librarian, and the secretary of state, or other persons designated to represent them, shall meet at the call of the secretary of state to set the requirements for form, style, materials, and content of biennial reports." (copy of applicable law on reverse side)

It is in that capacity that I introduced the subject bill. The intent of the bill is to remove several obsolete provisions from the Century Code and provide consistency in reporting requirements.

Section 1: It removes text in the Century Code, which states that the state's research extension centers must submit a biennial report to the Board of Higher Education if the Board submits a biennial report to the Governor and Secretary of State. However, the provisions of N.D.C.C. § 54-06-04 do not require the Board of Higher Education to submit a biennial report. Therefore, the text is meaningless.

<u>Section 2:</u> The current law implies that the Bonding Fund is to submit a separate biennial report. However, the Bonding Fund is under the jurisdiction of the insurance Commission and the Commissioner includes the report for the Bonding Fund in the Commissioner's biennial report. The changes make that distinction and the Commissioner agrees with it.

Section 3: It changes the requirement that the Board of Massage Therapists "shall" submit a report to that it "may" submit a report. This change makes its reporting requirement consistent with other professional boards that "may" submit a report and which do not have a "shall" reporting requirement.

Section 4: Same reasoning for the Psychologists Board as given for Section 3 above.

Section 5: It eliminates a reference to the Governor, which is redundant, and it eliminates the State Library that receives copies of biennial reports under N.D.C.C. § 54-24-09, which requires all state agencies to forward eight copies of all agency publications to the Library.

<u>Section 6:</u> It changes the biennial report submission time for the Council on the Arts from October (established in 1967), prior to the legislative session, to December 1, after the regular session of the legislative assembly. The change makes their biennial submission requirements consistent with the requirements for all other biennial reports.
