REP. WESLEY BELTER. CHAIRMAN Called the hearing to order.

REP. LARRY BELLEW. DIST. 38 MINOT Introduced the bill on behalf of all the park districts in North Dakota. He stated he was not an expert of the financing in the bill, so referred all questions.

REP. ANDY MARAGOS. DIST. 3. MINOT. Co-sponsored the bill, stating he fully supported what the bill is trying to accomplish.

MIKE NIELSON, PARK BOARD COMMISSIONER, MINOT Testified in support of the bill. Explained why they were at the legislature two years ago and are here again. Two years ago, the legislature consolidated all the park district mills. At that time, park districts were allowed one mill for health insurance. At that time we asked for two additional mills, and at that time, I was told, the park district would get more money for health insurance. The consolidation of mills went through, and with that, they dropped the one mill for health insurance. Our

insurance for health insurance is quite high. With the one mill, we did have, we were able to buy good health insurance. Without designated health insurance money, unfortunately, we chip away at the funds we do have. We wish for the two mills so our health insurance is a designated package. The premium increased eleven thousand dollars in one year. With health insurance costs going up all of the time, I don't want to give park board commissioners the opportunity to reduce benefits to employees by having to fight between maintenance costs and health insurance costs.

REP. BELTER What does the city do, they have a parate fund for health insurance.

MIKE NIELSON In Minot, they have self-insurance for the city employee. I understand there is a bill that is being introduced, that cities would also have a health mill levy put in. The counties now have four mills for health insurance.

REP. IVERSON Will this affect the total number of mills?

MIKE NIELSON It would increase it. I noticed in the bill that when they consolidated the mills, it went to 35 mills, I don't believe anyone in this state, has had 35 mills. With the addition of adding 2 mills for health insurance, this would drop from 35 to 34. It would be one additional mill.

With no further testimony, the hearing was closed.
