Rep. Mark Dosch - Dist. 32 - Introduced Bill (meter 27) Read Testimony - Attachment #1. Sited example of a hotel prank by High School kids in taking off the emergency drain valve on hotel sprinkler. This flooded the parking lot. Not only was there the expense of the fire department and repair but the liability of a flooded, ice filled parking, lot in the 10 degree weather with all the guests having to exit the building.

Sen. Trenbeath discussed do to age of the kids this bill will only leave to a juvenile referral, if anything. They can not be convicted to a crime.

Rep Dosch stated that sometimes some of the kids are above 18 years of age.
