This Bill is a big concern for dealers, farmers and basically I am going to keep my remarks short. What the bill dose is give civil immunity for thest of anhydrous ammonia. If is my property, my product and my equipment, I don't think I should be liable for the unlawful acts of someone coming in and trying to destroy or my product. I ask for your support on this bill.

REPRESENTATIVE POLLERT: I don't know about the Senate but in the judiciary committee, the Attorney General has brought forth numerous meth bills and if I am correct one bill is similar in scope. It goes a few steps further as I think HB 1352 which would require locks, lock boxes on all anhydrous tanks. We don't think that bill will solve our problems. CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: Rep. Eckre.

REPRESENTATIVE ECKRE. I am on both bills also. I do believe this bill HB 1222 is a better bill. It includes more things. Which is a benefit to the Erg. Community. I do want to support this bill. Thank you

CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: Any questions. Take next testimony ion support of 1222.

MARK SITZ: N.D. FARMERS UNION. We stand in support of HB 1222.

We have a meth problem in North Dakota which is growing. It is unforturate that farmers are being victimized. Really stealing his anhydrous ammonia. This bill will take care of the liability to the farmers. It is important law to have in place. We recognize this bill going a little further then 1352. This bill included the dealers.

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JOHN MITTLEIDER: ND FARM BUREAU. We are here to support 1222. We think it is a little broader bill. It supports dealers. And others that may be in the process of handling and using anhydrous. In response to Rep. Kingsbury's comment on 1352, The

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Attorney General has discussed with us his amendments. That Bill, he is looking at conducting a pilot project. We are working with him as we speak. Farmers up in the Williston area to attempt to work through this pilot program. We don't think the locks bill is really going to what was it was intended for.

REPRESENTATIVE KREIDT: Who is going to pay for the locks.

JOHN MITTLEIDER: The logistics are not worked out yet. One arm of our organization is Nodak Mutual. Maybe they will put up some funding. As to buying locks.

VICE CHAIRMAN POLLERT: Is it 70 to 80 percent of the anhydrous is imported into this state. For our meth or 80 percent of the meth is imported.

JOHN MITTLEIDER: That is the number that I recall. Obviously the largest concentration of meth labs is in the Williston area.

GARY KNUTSON: With the ND Agriculture Association. In our membership we have approximately 300 dealers that handle a lot of fertilizer etc. And they have been pretty close in tracking this. We have worked with Rep. Pollert in terms of getting some introduction. As to liability for our farmers in this issue. We feel this is critical. This is an ugly problem. We are monitoring. Land security. Surveillance problem. We hope there will be a compound added to the ammonia so it will be unusable.

REPRESENTATIVE ONSTAD: The Attorned General has a retail meth program dealing with retailers and selling it. Some of the products involved in meth. Is there an education meth program. In conjunction with the Attorney Generals Office to deal with the dealers. As far as security goes. Surveillance cameras.

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GARY KNUTSON: We quite extensively addressed this problem last winter. Various cities in ND. This is about a five hour program. The dealers were encouraged to bring there staff to meetings. The Agr. Department under Mr Wagner put together a good program we also discussed surveillance and a lot of issues. We continue to communicate on security matters. We were in opposition to the Attorney General bill because of the locks. We don't feel like that is a solution.

CYDE KREBS. SECOND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE GRAIN DEALERS ASSOCIATION.

I own and operate a fertilizer and feed plant at Glen Ullin. The NDGDA supports HB
