#### HOUSE BILL 1236 TESTIMONY OF REP. LAWRENCE R. KLEMIN HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE FEBRUARY 4, 2003

Mr. Chairman and members of the House Judiciary Committee. I am Lawrence R. Klemin, Representative from District 47 in Bismarck. I am here today to testify in support of House Bill 1235.

In the 2001 Legislative Session, I sponsored a bill to significantly expand the requirements for DNA testing to include persons convicted of most major felonies. The law had previously applied only to sex offenders. The law that was passed in the 2001 Session included a sunset clause and the law now expires on July 31, 2004. One purpose of House Bill 1235 is to remove the sunset clause so that the law will not automatically expire.

Another purpose of House Bill 1235 is to expand the DNA testing requirements to include persons convicted of all felonies. The bill also makes clarifications in the law to confirm the original intent that the DNA testing would be required of persons already in prison for conviction of felonies, not just those newly convicted.

Finally, the bill makes it clear that convictions will not been reversed simply because DNA samples may have been placed in the data base by mistake. This does not mean that convictions can't be reversed for other reasons, but eliminates a technicality.

The DNA data base is used as part of a national program to identify offenders of unsolved crimes. It can also be used to exonerate persons previously convicted of crimes they did not commit as evidence becomes available.

#### HOUSE BILL 1236 TESTIMONY OF REP. LAWRENCE R. KLEMIN SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE **MARCH 18. 2003**

Mr. Chairman and members of the Senate Judiciary Committee. I am Lawrence R. Klemin, Representative from District 47 in Bismarck. I am here today to testify in support of House Bill 1235.

In the 2001 Legislative Session, I sponsored a bill to significantly expand the requirements for DNA testing to include persons convicted of most major felonies. The law had previously applied only to sex offenders. The law that was passed in the 2001 Session included a sunset clause and the law now expires on July 31, 2004. One purpose of House Bill 1235 is to remove the sunset clause so that the law will not automatically expire.

Another purpose of House Bill 1235 to to make a clarification in the law to confirm the original intent that the DNA testing would be required of persons already in prison for conviction of felonies, not just those newly convicted. This is the reason for changing the word "and" to "or" in Section 1 on page 1, line 17. Another clarification is in Section 2 to confirm that the DNA data base applies to all applicable criminal offenses, not just to sex related crimes.

Finally, the bill makes it clear that convictions will not been reversed simply because DNA samples may have been placed in the data base by mistake. This does not mean that convictions can't be reversed for other reasons, but eliminates a technicality.

The DNA data base is used as part of a national program to identify offenders of unsolved crimes. It can also be used to exonerate persons previously convicted of crimes they did not commit as evidence becomes available.
