

Good Morning Chairman Froseth and members of the House Political Sub-Divisions Committee, it is a pleasure to appear before you today. For the record I am Rep. Bill Devlin, of Finley and represent, along with Rep. Severson, District 23 in the House of Representatives.

I am here today to ask your support of HB 1262. It is a little house-keeping bill involving county government. This bill cleans up some confusing situations involving members of a county commission who have been appointed to other county boards because they are a county commissioner.

What happens or should happen when their county commissioner term is up is the matter of question. If their appointment was made because they are a county commissioner, shouldn't their appointments on the other boards end at the same time? This is the belief of most of us who have been involved in county government as a commissioner.

I believe the commissioner's term on the other board should end with their commissioner term. Unless of course, the new county commission reappoints the former commissioner to the same board as a private citizen.

Usually there are two types of appointments involved in these type of situations, but only one creates a problem. In one case, using my home county as an example, a county commissioner is appointed to another county board like the county job authority. The requirement of membership for the position is that they be a county commissioner serving as the commissioners representative. In that case their term on the job authority board ends with their commission term. They might be reappointed to the board in another capacity as a private citizen, however they won't be the commissioner representative.

In the other case, and this is where the problem lies, is a board like a social service or perhaps water board where the county commission wants one or more of their members on the board. There is no requirement that that position be held by a county commissioner, but it is the intent of the county governing board that the person serving be a commissioner.

If that person has been appointed to the position for a term longer than the length of their commission term they are sometimes unwilling to leave the board. This creates a number of difficulties for the local board who are forced to go through a process of removing that individual. This can create a very unpleasant situation for everyone.

I believe HB 1262 will take care of that problem. It simply says that if you were appointed to be a county commission representative on another board, your term will end when you finish with your commission duties. The local board of commissioners will still have the authority to reappoint the former commissioner to the board as a private citizen.

I also have an amendment proposed by the Attorney General's office that I would like you to consider. When the bill was drafted we were only thinking about a commission term that was expiring. However, there are certainly instances when a commissioner may not fill out their whole term for a variety of reasons. This amendment will address that situation. It essentially says that if your position as a county commissioner ends, whether you are at the end of your term or not, your position on the other boards ends as well. Of course, they are always eligible for reappointment as a private citizen.

Chairman Froseth and members of the committee I respectively ask for a do pass recommendation on this bill. I appreciate the opportunity to be here today and would welcome any questions.
