Senator Thomas Fischer, Chairman of the Senate Natural Resources Committee opened the hearing on HB 1380 relating to gratis licenses to hunt deer.

All members of the committee were present except **Senator Michael Every**.

Representative David Monson of District 10 cosponsor of HB 1380 introduced the bill stating the bill would allow a landowner a little more flexibility to be able to get a buck deer during the season.

Roger Rostvet. Deputy Director of the North Dakota Game and Fish Department testified in a part neutral and part positive position of HB 1380. He explained these licenses would be withdrawn from the regular deer gun lottery and count as a deer gun lottery license for the individual. It would not count against the bow or muzzleloader numbers. It would not change harvest numbers much and the administration would be simple to handle by the department.

TESTIMONY HB 1380 Representative David Monson

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee. For the record, my name is David Monson, State Representative for District 10 in northeastern North Dakota.

I am here to speak in favor of **HB 1380**. HB 1380 is a hunting bill that is, I hope, the least controversial of all your hunting bills this season. It adds one line to present code and allows a person to use his or her gratis deer license in any season (bow, gun, or muzzleloader) until filled. Presently, the applicant for a gratis license must choose which season he or she wishes to hunt. If this bill is passed, it simply gives the gratis licensee the flexibility to bow hunt. If not successful, he or she could hunt with that same license during the deer gun season. If not successful there, it gives the licensee a chance to fill the tag during the muzzleloader season. Only **one** deer can be taken with the license, the only difference being that it is more flexible as to the three seasons.

This bill was suggested by one of my constituents. I talked to Dean Hildebrand of ND Game & Fish before submitting the bill. He saw no problems with it. I hope you don't either and give your favorable support. I would be happy to answer any questions.
