Minutes: <u>Chairman Klein</u>: opened the hearing on HB 1386. All committee members were present.

Representative Schmidt: appeared in favor of HB 1386. This bill came about because of the auctioneers. Before you get a license you have to buy a bond, which the state requires. Over the years the fee has gone up a little bit, but the auctioneers have asked me to bring to you is to why those bonds we pay for are not companied in North Dakota. There are 2 companies that bond auctioneers and clerks, one of them is in South Carolina and the other is in South Dakota.

Our bonds money is being sent out of state. The auction sale barns are bonded. People have to be bonded where is that money going to? As of yesterday they have 328 auction bonds at \$100.00 each. There are also 24 clerks at \$100.00 each. There were approximately 600 auctioneers last year. Every penny of that money went out of state. If you have to use your bond you have to pay it back, and right away and if you don't pay it back your out of business.

Senator Urlacher opened the hearing on HB1386. All committee members are present. This bill relates to providing for a legislative council study of bonds required by law.

Representative Arlo Schmidt (mtr #913) - Introduced the bill and explained its intent. Testimony included the lack of a bonding company in North Dakota along with the number of people that carry some to of a bond. Also talked about his business, auctioneer, the amount of fees paid for a bond and the number of times a bond has been used (none). Senator Urlacher (mtr #1555) - You are suggesting a mechanism similar to the fuel tank issue, where they were not able to buy insurance for liability purposes. Where a portion of your licensing fee sent in towards a fund to build for the purpose of bonding?

Representative Schmidt (mtr #1590) - That was changed, that organization no longer buys a bond, they buy errors and omissions insurance. Talked about a fund for auctioneers for the bond. Auctioneers do not like to use their bond as they would be out of business.

Senator Wardner (mtr #1741) - Example, if I started a bonding company, would I have to be bonded?

Representative Schmidt (mtr #1753) - Not sure of that. It is hard to find a company that sells bonds. Western Surety of SD is the bonding company most use. We are sending youth, cattle, and money out of state.

Senator Wardner (mtr #1861) - Regarding the North Dakota risk insurance fund, is that what you envision?

Representative Schmidt (mtr #1881) - The ND Insurance Reserve Fund has been mentioned, but we as auctioneers don't know the direction to take. Decided to put a bill together to address.

Senator Urlacher (mtr #1944) - If part of the license fee went to a bonding fund with a reasonable
