Minutes:

Rep: Weisz, Chairman opened the hearing on HB 1409, a bill for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision j of subsection 2 of section 39-04-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to disabled American veteran's number plates.

Rep: Maragos representing District 3 and happily sponsored HB 1409 on behalf of a constitute in Minot. He is a disabled American Veteran. He felt that he should be able to have the Internationally accepted sign for handicapped on his license plate.

Rep. Weisz: Is it your intent to issue a numbered license plate to the disabled?

Rep: Maragos: He already gets a specialized plate issue to American veterans. He wants the disabled symbol to be added to the plate -- simply one other symbol added to show that he was handicapped. They already may have another symbol on there such as the Purple Heart.

Arnold Maier: I am a World war II veteran. I am also a disabled veteran. I have a Purple Heart on my license plate. If this bill would effect the purple heart on my license plate I would be strictly opposed to this bill.

Rep. Price: To your knowledge is this something brought forth by a constitute or by an organization -- the disabled vets?

Arnold Maier: This is the first I have heard of it.

Keith Kyser: Director of the Motor Vehicle division of the ND DOT. The DOT is not opposed to this bill but there are some discussion points. There approximately 210 qualifies disabled American veterans in North Dakota who are displaying the DAV license. This bill directly relates to the plates on those vehicles at this time. Mr. Maier referenced the purple heart plate -- that plate is not directly effected by this bill. The bill would require the DOT to put the international symbol of access on all of those plates. That symbol would allow parking in handicapped zones. Not all disables American veterans qualify for -- you can be qualified as a disabled veteran for non-mobility purposes. If that is the intent of this legislation -- I do believe that the handicapped legislation which is in place would have to be amended to include disabled American Veterans -- so that person would be qualified to park in the handicapped designated spaces. If the constituent was handicapped he would already be qualified for a handicap plate. If they want us to design a plate with both symbols on it we could do that administratively therefore we really wouldn't need this legislation. We did do that not too long ago with a motorcycle plate.

Rep. Ruby: (15.0) How would you put those symbols on and still leave the purple heart symbol on?

Keith Kyser: Disabled American Veterans plates do not have a purple heart on them. That is a different type of license plate created by this legislative body called a veterans cemetery license plate. Those plate -- you can get those symbols on including your branch of service, that is a different type of plate. It is not a DAV plate. It is entirely different piece of legislation.

Rep. Weisz: I am not clear on this -- you say you can accommodate this bill by doing exactly what?

Keith Kyser: It is our belief -- that we design license plates --I believe what Rep. Maragos was asking was that if a constituent already qualifies for a handicapped placard -- but wanted that symbol put on his DAV plate. So he doesn't loose his DAV plate to get a handicapped plate. I don't believe that issue has been brought to our office before --- if it had I believe we would have said that it is within our legal authority to change the handicapped plate to add that symbol. On our plates there is room for 7 characters -- DAV license plates have six -- DAV followed by three digits -- in that 7th place we could put that international symbol on that plate.

Jim Coates: I am a former Representative from District 34. Mr. Maier -- if I am not mistaken you paid for your purple heart on your plates. Just like the Veterans branch of service on the plates. The DAV letters are symbolic of Disabled Americans Veterans --- unless I am wrong those plates are recognized as mobility handicapped -- at least the cops won't tag you. The DAV plate with handicapped parking symbol won't be effective -- there is still a stop on the plate for the handicapped symbol.

Rep. Weisz: Would you or any one present be opposed if the DOT administratively did add the symbol to the DAV plate?

Jim Coates: No -- if if they are qualified and they want a vanity plate let them go ahead.

The cost of the new license plates is estimated to be \$700.
