We use the intermediate court of appeals when the Supreme Court load gets too large or if there is a vacancy in the court and have trouble getting the caseload out. We don't use it very often, though.

Chairman DeKrey: Thank you.

Rep. Klemin: This started in 1987, and then the sunset clause was extended for four years.

Chief Justice VanderWalle: Yes, and then it was after 2 years, and then it went to every 4

years.

Rep. Klemin: Could this sunset clause be removed all together.

Chief Justice Vander Walle: That would be acceptable to us.
