

Minutes: Chairman Klein: called the meeting to order. All committee members were present.

Representative Grande: testified in favor of HB 1451 and also was a sponsor. The Capitol entrance has been closed since 9-11-01. There are barriers in place in the tunnel entrance. The Captiol is a big part of tourism in the state, we would like to see an entrance put in place that would welcome the community and visitors to the state.

Because it is on state property we would have to put it out on bids. It is in code already and we were looking for this one kind of exemption to it, so we could get the publics input.

Don Barsness, Citizen at large, Architect: testified in favor of HB 1451. In the year 2000 the commission hired a firm to update the capitol grounds master plan. The original plan was done in the 1960's and was far outdated. Part of the recommendations is the vehicular drive thru. The tunnel becoming closed came about before 9-11-01. Part of the response to the Oklahoma situation that came about. Anyway that was to be closed and be only a pedestrian access, and also the circular drive be moved closer to the front steps. The commission has been discussing

this for some time and want to move forward in doing something about that particular part.

There are considerable number of recommendations in the report itself. Competitions have specific formats and also the state refers to retaining professional services based on qualifications and criteria, and how to go about that. Once the submittals and interviews are done on the committee, they rank the top 3 contacted for the actual commission. At that point they are to negotiate with the number one rank or go forward with the project, if we want to do a competition there is a complication there obviously. So what the bill is attempting to address is that how the final selection is being made, what we are suggesting is that the final 3 that are ranked in the submittal by the jury that they would be allowed to compete in the competition.

Representative Klein: the committee is the planning commission?

Don Barsness: yes, or whoever we would designate. They would then allow these 3 firms a solution for the project. During the competition or the design stages, public hearings would be held for those in the design process to hear the wishes of the people of the state. Once the submittals are turned in and the jury has decided which ones they like best, they would rank those as one, two and three. The second and third would receive a small cash prize for their work but the first would be given the project to go forward. There are some amendments to the bill being passed out by Representative Grande. I think that covers everything that I want to address. Representative Klein: are you the architect that put together the long range plan for the capitol grounds?

Don Barsness: no.

Representative Haas: are you saying that the commission would be bound by that public vote on which of the 3 finalists that they like?

<u>Don Barsness</u>: the intent, is for the state and the commission is to participate in hearings to hear what the desires and wishes of the state or people have.

Then those firms would use those designs they commission, then it would be up to the commission to determine which one of the three solutions did the best job of satisfying them.

Representative Klemin: so we give the second place \$10,000, and the third place \$5,000 and it says in the fiscal note that they budget capitol ground planning commission. Then the one who wins we say that will be determined based on available funds, what if we don't have available funds then and actually build this. It's one thing to design something and I guess its something else to go out and get all the necessaries to do this, so is it possible that we might have the winner actually getting a contract for a design that can't be fullfilled because there are no available funds and we can't build it anyway, it might be better to win second place.

Representative Potter; is there any time frame that we are looking at here it doesn't say in the bill.

<u>Don Barsness</u>: we have estimated sometime in the next 12 months that we would go through the process of developing the program. At least a year.

Jack Dalrymple, Lt. Governor of North Dakota: appeared in favor of HB 1451. I am the chairman of the Capitol Grounds Planning Committee, and I just want to make a couple of comments about this bill. One is that I think it is just an authorization that we would like to have, we don't have any big plan to spend a bunch of money, we have some money of our own, that we can use for what ever we like, perhaps we will do something very modest with the south entrance. But before we can proceed and even come up with some concepts, we want to be sure we could have this competition that we are talking about. And so we are just seeking the

authority, we may have been able to do this anyhow but we want to make sure there are no legal problems with it. I guess one thing we have decided at the commission that we need to do something with the south entrance you can no longer drive thru it. As an entrance to the capitol it doesn't work very well. We need to make it clear where the entrance to the building is and make it clear that the people are invited to come in that direction.

One of the things that we require to whoever will do this is that must do a extensive process of public relations that would include ideas on designs before they build.

John Boyd, Director of Facility Management: appeared in favor of HB 1451 and submitted written testimony prepared by Joe Leopald, State Planner who could not be here today.

Just to make my comments as brief as possible, one of my duties as facility management is to

actually implement the approved project by the Capitol Grounds Planning Commission. I think as stated here already that this would be the best and most efficient way to get it through that.

Closed the hearing on HB 1451.

Representative Sitte: made a motion to <u>AMEND</u> HB 1415 as presented by Representative Grande.

Madam Chairman

Members of the Government and Veterans Affairs committee
My name is James Martel I retired from the USAF at Minot AFB as a MSgt. I am
currently employed by the State of North Dakota, for the record I am on annual leave for
this hearing and the views expressed during my statement are solely my own.
I am here to express my opposition to House Bill 1451 and Engrossed House Bill 1451.
The main points for concern in the Engrossed Bill as written are:

- 1. Line 9. We are planning to give ten thousand dollars to the runner up and five thousand to third place. They did not win the competition so why are we giving them a cash award? According to the training I have received, the normal procedure would be for the state to call for bids including plans for the job. Private companies routinely bid on projects but do not necessarily win the bid—it is a cost of doing business. A good question here is. Do we as the state really need to entice architects to submit building designs?
- 2. Line 10. The commission shall award the contract for the design of the project to the first place winner (there is no mention about the bids or cost of the winner designing the plans) There appears to be no money allocated in the bill to pay the architect for the final design. This means they will have to wait until the next budget years before completing the designs.

In this time of budget cuts is it really a good idea to be spending fifteen thousand dollars to purchase a design for the remodeling of the south entrance of the capitol building? Why does the legislature continue to tell, the public that the state has no money for essential human needs and we all need to tighten our financial belts, but then goes out and spends fifteen thousand dollars on a project that the state can not afford? I feel that this would send a very clear message to the people of North Dakota, and that message is: Regardless of the tight budget or the needs of our less fortunate, we can still spend whom money as we see fit, even on things not really necessary like preliminary designs to remodel the capitol building south entrance. I do agree the south entrance could possibly be designed better but not at this time of severe budget cutting. I recommend sending, this bill on with a committee suggestion of DO NOT PASS.
