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### Testimony on HB1494 Rep. David Monson

Good morning Madam Chair and members of the House Education Committee. For the record, I am Rep. David Monson from Dist. 10 in northeastern ND.

I thought of this idea early in the session when DOT was before the House Appropriations Committee. They were testifying that the cost of asphalt was up due to the cost of crude oil being higher. As a result, they would not be able to do as many miles of roads as in previous years without an increase in their budget to buy the needed asphalt. I started wondering if there were other cheaper alternatives to asphalt. They didn't know of any when I asked. They mentioned some recycling is going on and that fly ash and other alternatives are being used in concrete, but very little is being done in asphalt. I talked with some other people about this, and they said they had heard there was some research using plastics or polymers but knew very little about it.

I went to legislative council to see if I could get a study resolution to see if it would be feasible for the state to find alternatives for asphalt to stretch our highway construction dollars. The person to whom I talked there suggested a bill directing a research institution (UND or NDSU) to do the study, perhaps in their engineering department or as a graduate study. So, here I am with this bill. I believe they can do this with little or no money, and with the new entreprenuership initiatives they are promoting, if it turns out to be a viable idea, perhaps we can see a new company in ND. I think if we can find a use for the waste coal tar or even a use for our ND lignite coal, it would be a great thing for ND and our road construction problems.
