The adoption of this bill will do the following:

Section 1: Allow the electronic filling of partnership fictitious name certificates.

Sections 2 and 3: Eliminate a \$10 fee, reduce the number of forms needed when a partnership changes the address of their principal office, and change a timeline. Because the fee is rarely paid, it will be more expedient and less expensive to change the address when the information is provided by the partnership than attempt to collect the fee. In Section 2, the mailing time for a renewal notice for a partnership fictitious name certificate is changed from 60 to 90 days prior to its expiration date. This will make it consistent with the change that is being made in Section 7.

Section 4: Exempt social security numbers and federal ID numbers from the open records law when they are recorded on a partnership fictitious name registration form.

Section 5: Allow the electronic filing of trade name registrations.

<u>Section 6</u>: Provide that a trade name registration cannot include a business structure identifier in the trade name unless the filer, and subsequent owner of the trade name, is an identical business structure.

Section 7: Allow trade name renewal registrations to be filed within 90 days of their expiration date. Even though the law mandates the Secretary of State's office to mail renewal notices 90 days prior to a trade name's expiration date, the current law prohibits the filing of those renewals until after the 30th day before the expiration date. The change will result in processing efficiencies because the renewals can be filed as soon as they are returned rather than having to wait until after the 30-day threshold.

Section 8: Change a word related to trade name registrations from "provided" to "prescribed."

<u>Section 9</u>: Exempt social security numbers and federal ID numbers from the open records law when they are recorded on a trade name registration form.

Section 7: Allow trade name renewal registrations to be filed within 90 days of their expiration date. Even though the law mandates the Secretary of State's office to mail renewal notices 90 days prior to a trade name's expiration date, the current law prohibits the filing of those renewals until after the 30th day before the expiration date. The change will result in processing efficiencies because the renewals can be filed as soon as they are returned rather than having to walt until after the 30-day threshold.

Section 8: Change a word related to trade name registrations from "provided" to "prescribed."

<u>Section 9</u>: Exempt social security numbers and federal ID numbers from the open records law when they are recorded on a trade name registration form.
