TESTIMONY OF HAROLD NEAMEYER CASS COUNTY WILDLIFE CLUB

PRESENTED TO THE HOUSE NATURAL RESOURCE COMMITTEE ON HB 1501, FEBRUARY 13, 2003

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

I am Harold Neameyer speaking on behalf of the Cass County Wildlife Club. The Cass County Wildlife Club opposes HB 1501 basically because it denies a landowner the right to hunt his or her own property. It infringes on private property rights. As the bill is written, a landowner would have to ask a neighbor for permission to hunt one's own land.

Hunters need to exercise common sense and safety when near occupied buildings. There is a world of difference between bow hunting and rifle hunting for deer. This bill does allow hunters inside the restricted zone to hunt on public lands.

The club opposes this HB 1501.

The United Sportsmen of North Dakota and the N.D. Wildlife Federation are opposed to this bill unless it is amended.

The changes suggested in line 7 would not allow property owners to hunt on all of their property if the occupant of a dwelling near a property line objected.

We ask for the following amendment:

- 1. Line 7 delete: not
- 2. Line 7 Delete: the strikeover of "upon the premises of another,"

Assuming line 7 is amended, then line 9 after the period should remove "This section does" and replace that with "Permission and consent do....."
