Northwest Venture Communities Inc. (NVCI) is a "grassroots" regional organization that originated in spring of 2002. NVCI is developing a 10-year strategic plan to reduce poverty and improve the quality of life in an eight county area of North Dakota. This includes Bottineau, Burke, McHenry, McLean, Mountrail, Pierce, Renville, Ward Counties and Three Affiliated Tribes of Fort Berthold of North Dakota.

NVCI was formed after the Northwest Area Foundation of St. Paul, Minnesota selected the region in North Dakota to take part in their Community Ventures Program. The Northwest Area Foundation has selected sites in Iowa, Montana, Idaho, and North Dakota to develop and submit regional plans to reduce poverty and improve quality of life by October 15, 2003. They are indicating the potential to choose up to two plans to form long term partnerships with. If the Northwest Area Foundation choose the North Dakota plan, they may provide 6 to 13 million dollars to implement selected strategies outlined in the plan.

Hundreds of residents from the region are involved in the project. They are working together to plan how individuals, families, and communities can prosper and rise above some of the challenges we are facing. Northwest Venture Communities Inc. refers to its regional endeavors as "Dakota Dreams, Partnering for Prosperity" because partners

What is the Northwest Venture Communities, Inc. (NVCI), Dakota Dreams, Partnering for Prosperity?

- NVCI is a local organization that has been formed in response to an opportunity that has been offered to our region by the Northwest Area Foundation.
- The opportunity is to become a Community Ventures program where we develop a strategic plan to reduce poverty.
- Northwest Venture Communities has named our regional project "Dakota Dreams, Partnering for Prosperity" because we want to encourage participants to envision how we can partner to improve the quality of life and reduce poverty throughout our region.
- Our region includes: Burke, Bottineau, McHenry, McLean, Mountrail, Pierce, Renville, Ward Counties and Three Affiliated Tribes of Fort Berthold of North Dakota.
- A Board of Directors has been formed to initiate/administer regional activities.

What is the Northwest Area Foundation?

- The Foundation is a private philanthropic organization located in St. Paul Minnesota. It was established in 1934 by Louis W. Hill, son of James J. Hill, founder of the Great Northern Railway.
- The Foundation is committed to an eight-state region. The region includes Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, and Iowa.
- Foundation assets total approximately \$ 450 million.
- The Foundation's mission is to help communities in its eight-state region reduce poverty.

What is the Community Ventures program?

- The Community Ventures program is one of three programs at the Foundation focused on reducing poverty in lasting ways. Through the Ventures program, the Foundation will form partnerships of 10 years with approximately 16 communities throughout its region. The Foundation's total investment in the Community Ventures program is expected to be approximately \$150 million.
- Currently, two long-term partnerships have been approved by the Foundation. One is located in Miner County, South Dakota and the other is in Central Oregon. Five other communities in the eight-state region are in the exploration stage.

Why is the Northwest Area Foundation inviting four regional communities to submit strategic plans that focus on poverty reduction?

- The Northwest Area Foundation is exploring the feasibility of a long-term partnership with four regional communities.
- The Foundation will provide substantial financial support to each of the four communities to participate in an 18-month long process to create strategic plans that will move the region toward its envisioned future. Up to two of the four regions may be selected by the Foundation for a long-term partnership, based on how well components of the submitted strategic plans align with the Foundation's criteria.

Who are the four regional communities that are currently in the Northwest Area Foundation Community tures program?

- Minot, North Dakota Region 8 Counties and the Three Affiliated Tribes of Fort Berthold.
- Pocatello/Idaho Falls, Idaho 16 Counties and Shoshone-Bannock Tribes.
- Great Falls, Montana 11 counties and Blackfeet, Chippewa Cree and Gros Ventre Tribes.
- Waterloo/Cedar Falls, Iowa 8 Counties and Sac & Fox Tribe of Mississippi in Iowa.

What are the activities we (eight counties/Three Affiliated Tribes) must complete to be successful?

- We want and need citizen, organizational, and community involvement.
- We must work together.
- Conduct community/regional meetings.
- Conduct a thorough regional analysis.
- Reach consensus.
- Complete and submit a regional plan.

What must be included in our regional community plan?

Six criteria must be included in the plan when it is submitted to the Northwest Area Foundation. The plan must:

- 1. Focus on reducing poverty in the regional community. It should include a community definition of poverty and a potential to reduce poverty.
- 2. Involve diverse interests. Getting diverse community members involved in activities, especially those who are often not involved in community planning.
- 3. Do no harm. Assurance that implementing the plan will not harm the social, ecological, and cultural well being of the community or another community.
- 4. Provide thoughtful and realistic strategies for accomplishing community goals. It should provide a long range vision, effective strategies and benchmarks.
- 5. Develop and identify local abilities to achieve long-term community goals. It should include who will invest resources (time, energy, etc.) to bring about change.
- 6. Be adaptable to new knowledge and changing circumstances. It should also show how learning will be shared.

How much time do we have to complete the plan?

• The first draft of the plan must be submitted to the Northwest Area Foundation by June 30, 2003. The final draft will be due October 15, 2003

How can I become involved with Northwest Venture Communities, Inc.?

Regional committees have been formed and are working on the following issues: Economic Development,
Out-Migration/Population, Community Support Services, Education, Leadership Development, Healthcare,
and Infrastructure/Government.
