Mr. Chairman, Members of the Committee, I am Harold Narum, Assistant Director of the Division of Emergency Management and the Office of the Homeland Security.

I am here today as a resource, to provide a brief statement regarding our readiness and to make you aware that we are very confident and comfortable that the Governor can implement plans and commit resources to effectively respond and protect the health and welfare of the citizens of North Dakota.

The North Dakota Disaster Act (ND Century Code 37-17.1) gives the Governor broad powers in the event of a major crisis.

To coincide with implementation of those powers, the State Emergency Operations Plan, which coordinates the response of all state agencies to respond and recover from emergency and disaster events, has been updated to include major terrorism events that may threaten our national security.

The 50 state agencies participating in the State Plan are currently involved in a multi-phased exercise, called Vigilant Victor, which is designed to test our ability to effectively implement our plans.

The Homeland Security Advisory System and the Emergency Alert System are in place and regularly tested to assure that our citizens can be properly advised should the need arise for heightened security measures.

A Division of Emergency Management staff and Office of Homeland Security Coordinator are in regular contact with National Homeland Security Department to track changes in the threat levels and the implications on North Dakota.

All state agencies designated in the plan regularly interface with their local, federal and private sector counterparts to assure lines of communication are open and functioning should they be needed.

The Homeland Security Coordinator and the Division Staff has taken every opportunity to speak to private sector and service groups to remind them that responding to such events is everyone's responsibility and that they will get there direction from authorities through the media and that they should report unusual activities to law enforcement authorities.

The Governor and state agency heads are briefed regularly on our homeland security status, and checklists that outline actions to be taken to assure our security have been developed for key state officials.

I am available to respond to any questions you may have!

WHEREAS, terrorism and pestilence pose serious threats to society that may require extraordinary measures to protect the privacy, health, and safety of the citizens of this state; and

WHEREAS, the North Dakota Disaster Act gives the Governor broad but appropriate powers in the event of a disaster or emergency; and

WHEREAS, the federal government is evaluating and reorganizing federal agencies to increase the national disaster readiness capability; and

WHEREAS, a review of disaster response readiness should be conducted to determine the adequacy of the state emergency management system, the impact of federal reorganization on the state's emergency operations plan, and the ability of state agencies and local governments to carry out that plan and ensure that this state is in a position to protect the health and welfare of its citizens if an extraordinary event were to occur;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Legislative Council study the state's emergency management system, the impact of federal emergency management reorganization on the state's emergency operations plan, and the emergency management preparedness of state agencies and local governments; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly.

Madame Chair, Members of the Committee, I am Doug Friez, Director of the Division of Emergency Management and the State's Homeland Security Coordinator.

I am here today to provide a brief statement regarding our Emergency Management and Homeland Security posture and to make you aware that we are confident and comfortable that the Governor can implement plans and commit resources to effectively respond and protect the health and welfare of the citizens of North Dakota.

The North Dakota Disaster Act (ND Century Code 37-17.1) gives the Governor broad but appropriate powers in the event of a disaster or emergency.

To coincide with implementation of those powers, the State Emergency Operations Plan, which coordinates the response of all state agencies to support local response to, and recovery from emergency and disaster events, has been updated to include Homeland Security initiatives. This plan enhancement process is an on-going effort of networking and documentation.

Additionally, the 50 state agencies tasked in the State Plan as well as local & tribal governments are currently involved in a multi-phased exercise, called Vigilant Victor, which is designed to test our ability to effectively implement our plans in a Homeland Security event.

The Homeland Security Advisory System and the Emergency Alert System are in place and regularly tested to help assure that our citizens can be properly advised should the need arise for heightened security measures. In fact, just this week these procedures were effectively implemented to support the national threat level change.

At the Division of Emergency Management we have established on going dialogue and operational interface with the federal Department of Homeland Security and its member agencies.

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All state agencies designated in the plan regularly interface with their local, federal and private sector counterparts to assure lines of communication are open and functioning should they be needed and to constantly facilitate the private, public and individual partnership required in this Homeland Security initiative as well as to ensure continued success in our pre-existing emergency management roles and responsibilities.

Myself and staff have met with private sector representatives, service groups and individuals to remind them that responding to such events is everyone's responsibility and that they will get their direction from authorities through various sources, and that they should report unusual activities to law enforcement authorities.

The Governor and state agency heads are briefed regularly on our homeland security and emergency management status, and there are checklists that outline actions to be taken to help assure the security and safety of our state and citizens.
