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SENATOR TOLLEFSON opened the hearing on HCR 3057.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR I am a Representative from District 28. One of the executive articles of a past Constitutional Convention was to make the Lieutenant Governor a full time state official and relieved of his duties of presiding over the state senate. Would like to see this resolution put on the ballot. This resolution was adopted by the 1995 legislative session. It was on the June 1996 primary and it received 45,000 yes votes and 63,000 no votes. It did not become law. I would hope we could put this on the ballot and let the people of our state decide. I believe that the Lieutenant Governor becoming a full time executive branch official, it would be better separation of power standpoint to have the senate presided over by one of its own members. Hopefully both houses will approve this.

REPRESENTATIVE HAWKEN Why, just because of the separation.

REPRESENTATIVE KRETSCHMAR That is basically the reason at this point in time.

SENATOR MATHERN I am a State Senator from District 11, and am a cosponsor of this resolution. The Senate is presently acting in this regard, and I think it is going to increase. There is expertise in the Senate that can address the duties of the presiding officer. The Lieutenant Governor does the duties that are important for the state and I think those duties need to be addressed when the senate is in session. I support the separation of power, and I also believe that there is a practical value to this in the interest of this state.
