

studying this project. He said they just finally got the approval of an outlet for Devils Lake, the only trouble is, the price tag has gone up to the point now where it would take approximately seventeen million dollars of local funds to match the cost.

SEN. JACK TRAYNOR, DIST. 15. DEVILS LAKE Testified in favor of the resolution.

He gave a brief history of the water problems in Devils Lake for the last several years. He stated the drinking water is in violation of government standards. They are in violation of the arsenic standards in the drinking water. He stated the cost will be approximately thirty million dollars which is above the capacity the city and residents can handle.

million dollar price tag of federal outlet is probably priced it out of the market. He stated he respects what the Corps was trying to do with respect to the congressional delegation trying to move it along. As we reach this point of excessive amount of dollars, if we could get some participation from the federal government, as this resolution points out, for the state outlet, along with a host of other things that we are doing in the basin right now, such as irrigation in the upper basin, there is grant money coming from several areas to put this in place, if that works, it will take more than a foot of water off. The third hurdle is the city water problem for Devils Lake, thirty million dollars is a huge amount of money. Maybe that can be cut some, but if we can get some of these state and federal dollars routed into what we are speaking to in this resolution, it will be a huge savings to the taxpayers. That is what this resolution is all about.

WHEREAS, business owners and homeowners adversely impacted by the rising flood waters of Devils Lake were able to use flood insurance proceeds and Federal Emergency Management Agency funds to relocate their homes and businesses: and

WHEREAS, property owners, including farmers and ranchers, that have been adversely impacted by the rising flood waters of Devils Lake have not received funds to reimburse them for their losses; and

WHEREAS, at least seven miles of a pipeline that supplies municipal drinking water to the city of Devils Lake has been inundated by the rising flood waters of Devils Lake making it impossible to service the pipeline which jeopardizes the drinking water supply for the city of Devils Lake; and

WHEREAS, the city of Devils Lake is being challenged to meet stricter drinking water standards for arsenic; and

WHEREAS, obtaining a new and reliable source of drinking water for the city of Devils Lake may cost as much as \$30 million; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Corp of Engineers has released its plans for a federal outlet to Devils Lake but the cost of constructing the federal outlet has increased dramatically; and

WHEREAS, it would be more economically feasible for the federal government to fund the state outlet;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly urges Congress to appropriate sufficient funds to reimburse property owners for land inundated by Devils Lake, reimburse the city of Devils Lake for municipal water lines inundated by Devils Lake, and to provide funding for a state outlet from Devils Lake; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution to each member of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation."

Senator Thomas Fischer, Chairman of the Senate Natural Resources Committee opened the hearing HCR 3078 urging the Congress to appropriate sufficient funds to reimburse property owners for land inundated by Devils Lake, reimburse the city of Devils Lake for municipal water lines inundated by Devils Lake, and to provide funding for a state outlet from Devils Lake. All members of the committee were present except Senator Michael Every and Senator Layton Freborg.

Representative Dennis Johnson of District 15 cosponsor of HCR 3078 testified stating this resolution addresses the long on going water issues in Devils Lake. He explained the three parts of the resolution. The first part deals with getting help for the inundated land of farmers, home owners, businesses and landowners. Over \$400 million has been interjected in the Devils Lake community but nothing has been done about the farm land that has been flooded. Many still continue to pay land taxes on flooded property in fear of losing their land if the water level

should recede. The second part of the resolution deals with the fresh water issue as the fresh water pipe line that supplies Devils Lake is 18 miles long and lies under 30 - 40 feet of water and silt. This pipe line is reaching its life expectancy and is only a matter of time until it fails. The lease for the pipe line that runs across the reservation most likely not be renewed. It will take approximately \$30 million for a new water source for Devils Lake and this resolution is asking for help to fund this project. The third part of the resolution deals with the solution for the problems by supplying funds for the Devils Lake outlet.

Senator John Traynor of District 15 cosponsor of HCR 3078 testified stating the main trust of the resolution is the plight of farmers and ranchers with regard to their income stream and the fact the much of their land is under 20 feet of water and will never see production there in their life time. So this resolution addresses the congress for some help.

There was no neutral or opposition to HCR 3078.

Senator Fischer closed the hearing on HCR 3078.

Senator Ben Tollefson made a motion for Do Pass of HCR 3078.

Senator Stanley Lyson second the motion.
