Minutes: Chair Keiser: Opened hearing on SB 2030

Jennifer Clark (Legislative Council): Explained bill. The Dept. of Commerce may have a web site and do not need a law to have the web site. This allows for the appropriation to continue this web site.

<u>Jim Hirsch</u> (Director of the ND Workforce Development Council): Supports with written testimony. The employers pay a subscription for the web site.

Rep. Klein: What is the charge for the subscription? Hirsch said that it varies from \$95 for a 30 day listing to \$250-\$2000 depending on the size of the firm and what they want with the service.

Rep. Johnson: Why is there a revised fiscal note? The revised clarifies that dollars brought in would be used, so there is no need for more appropriations.

Rep. Ekstrom: How many employers are registered now? What do you do to recruit. Hirsch said that Fargo and Grand Forks have quite a number of employers. The western 2/3s of ND just started the service. Right now they have two people serving as account executives who are

recruiting employers. They want to be self supporting by the next blennium. They also want to work with dislocated employees in other states, as well as recruiting alumni to return to ND.

Rep. Ekstrom: How many matches do you get through the web site? Hirsch replied that he is not sure since the site just started in January, but of the applicants the Dept. of Commerce has had, 20% of the applicants found the applications online.

Rep. Zaiser: How do these fees line up with other states? Hirsch said the top end of ND fees are about \$1000 less per year than most states.

Rep. Kasper: What does the commission get from the subscriptions? Hirsch said they get about 40% to reinvest.

Rep. Ekstrom: Do you survey the employers? Hirsch said that since the site just started, they have not had the chance yet. The Fargo employers would be a better sounding board.

Rep. Thorpe: Do you have solid figures on the number of jobs filled? Is it possible to get that? Hirsch said they only have 6 employers in the Bismarck area now. This site is to help young people make sound decisions. This is comprehensive for internships, alumni, etc. Rep. Thorpe then asked what level of jobs this site is addressing. Hirsch said they are usually higher end above \$25,000/yr, but some lower.

Rep. Zaiser: Have you had a chance to look at other states? Hirsch said that they are modeled after careerlink out of Fargo. Takes time to create an employment base and we need to be patient.

Rep. Keiser: Why not have Job Service do this? Hirsch said they worked with Job Service on this. This site is more customized. Keiser then asked what happens if we are successful and get

- All of the occupations listed that are in the category of worker shortage and skill gaps provide annual average incomes of \$25,000 or more.

Many industries will have 40% to 50% of their workforce reach retirement age in the next five to ten years. As individuals reach retirement age, the worker shortages will worsen.

It is critically important for the state's workforce development and workforce training system to develop effective strategies to help businesses continue to stay competitive.

In the last session, through Senate Bill 2019, the Workforce Development Division was given responsibility for development of a public/private statewide talent recruitment initiative.

A workgroup of local developers, business representatives, State Agencies and the North Dakota Workforce Development Council met to identify initiatives and establish priorities for Talent Recruitment.

A single statewide web site to support recruitment of alumni and out-of-state workers and support retention of youth was a priority.

At the time there were several competing web sites targeting recruitment of alumni and out-of-state workers (Project Back Home, CareerLinkNorth, along with several independent community web sites).

This presented barriers to effective recruitment of out-of-state workers.

- There was no coordination or linkages between the sites.
- Resumes filed in one site did not get exposed to employment opportunities listed on the other sites.
- There was a lack of marketing for the sites.

The workgroup had identified several specific operating requirements for a statewide web site. The web site had to provide seamless access for employers and job seekers to a job listing and resume management system. The web site needed to include the following operating features:

- clickable state map,
- up to 25 sub-sites.
- unique domain name for the state,
- · resume center,
- logo listings of employers,
- industry categorization,
- company profiles,
- fully automated posting and reposting functions,
- applicant tracking.
- free listing for internships, volunteer opportunities and career fairs,
- advanced HR automation capabilities,
- capacity of handling high volume (40-60,0000 weekly hits,
- and many other feature

The workgroup and the North Dakota Workforce Development Council reviewed the operating features of the existing web sites in the state:

- The Project Back Home web site;
- The CareerLinkNorth web site; and
- Design of a web site being planned by the Bismarck Mandan Development Association.

The CareerLinkNorth web site met all the operating features identified by the local development professionals.

The <u>www.NorthDakotaHasJobs.com</u> is a sister site that site mirrors the <u>www.CareerLinkNorth</u> web site available in Fargo and Grand Forks. The issue for communities interested in the CareerLinkNorth web site was the upfront investment required.

The Workforce Development Division, with support from various partners, negotiated an agreement with the AIM Institute, Applied Distribution Group, out of Omaha, Nebraska, for distribution rights to www.NorthDakotaHasJobs.Com for the Western 2/3rds of North Dakota. Site distribution for the Eastern third of the State is through Fargo/Cass Economic Development Association.

The Department of Commerce did not incur any upfront costs and does not have a responsibility for any maintenance cost for the web site.

Our requirement is to promote the web site, designate a contact for ADG to work with, and designate the equivalent of .5 FTE's for lead development, prospecting and sales. We do not have to provide direct staff to meet this requirement. This .5 FTE equivalent could come from local communities, local development professionals, etc.

Employers pay a subscription fee for the use of the system. The Department of Commerce receives a commission on subscriptions. The commission is reinvested back into promotion and marketing of the system.

The sites provide seamless access to a statewide job listing and resume management system to employers and job seekers.

- NorthDakotaHasJobs.Com is a cost effective online employment and resume management system for North Dakota employers.
- The Web Site is linked to the national Web Site WhoHasJobs.Com. This gives job listings on the NorthDakotaHasJobs.com additional exposure to job seekers across the country.
- The site will be marketed to alumni by direct mailings and to out-of-state workers through the network of Dislocated Worker Offices located in each state.
- The sites provide employers the opportunity to get information to students on their company, opportunities they offer and internships they provide.

Our business plan calls for the system to be self supporting by the next biennium.
