Minutes:

Senator Karen Krebsbach, Chairman opens SB 2051. Senators Krebsbach, Dever, Brown Wardner, Fairfield, Nelson all present.

Jay Buringrud, from the Legislative Council introduced the bill for Senator Stenejhem.

Jay Buringrud: This bill is a "housekeeping bill". It modernizes the statute on the agenda items for the Legislative organization session. Does not take effect until December 2004. What this bill does updates is for example subsection 2 the change recognizes that there are interim commissions, the most notable one is the advisory commission, subsection 3 recognizes current practices of selecting leaders before the organizational session convenes. Whether it is done a month before or a evening before that is when the leaders are usually selected. Subsection 4 recognizes that all procedural committees are appointed, not just the employment committees but all of them. For example Vonnie Peach. She needs to be appointed to two committees.

Subsections 5 and 6 are deleted to remove the specific reference to the appointment to the interim

senate committee on the committees. Subsection 6 is deleted because committee preferences are technically not given during the organizational session. They are given when the survey is sent out by Legislative Council to all members of Legislative Assembly sent back and given to leaders.

Senator Krebsbach: Questions from committee.

Senator Krebsbach: In other worked we are bringing the statue in to place with the procedure and process we are utilizing today?

Jay Buringrud: Yes, not to say that the current process is illegal, but the current process is covered under 6.

Senator Krebsbach: if our rules are being changed, in any way conflict with anything here which would take precedence?

Jay Buringrud: The rules would. The constitution provide that the legislature may adopt rules to govern this procedure.

Senator Dever: Does it spell out anywhere that it has to be 3 days or is that just the organizational session?

Jay Buringrud: I am not sure the length of the organizational session, it is just traditionally 3 days.

3 days is probably plenty, 2 days is probably expectable.

No further testimony in favor of, neutral, or against SB 2051.
