Minutes:

Chairman Freborg called the committee to order. Roll Call was taken with all (6) members present.

Chairman Freborg opened the hearing on SB 2066 relating to the revolving school district equipment and software fund.

Testimony in support of SB 2066:

Joe Linnertz, DPI, testified that the purpose of the bill is that the fund is no longer used. In the 1980's, there were only a couple makers of computers. There were purchasing arrangements with the companies that made it possible for the state to buy in quantities on behalf of the school districts. The companies quit honoring the agreements and the school districts began buying their own equipment from any number of different vendors. The State Auditor recommends this section of CC be repealed.

Senator Freborg asked if there was a sum of money that started this fund? Mr. Linnertz stated the legislation allowed the DPI to charge a handling fee which became the money which started the fund. When the fund was no longer needed in the early 90's the money that was in the fund was used to buy a copy of software for every school district in the state. He will find out if there was money left in the fund, what became of it. Senator Cook asked if this recommendation from the Auditor was taken from the last audit. Yes. The committee would like to know where the startup dollars came from. Mr. Linnertz stated he will get the information to the committee.

There was no opposing testimony.

The hearing was closed on SB 2066.

Revolving School District Equipment and Software Fund

Issue:

NDCC section 15.1-03-02 establishes this fund for the cooperative purchase, by school districts, of equipment and software. The superintendent shall place a service charge on any purchases to cover costs incurred in compiling purchase orders, preparing invoices, recording payments from school districts, and shipping the purchased goods. Clerical and related costs associated with this operation are also to be paid from this fund.

Status:

The Revolving School District Equipment and Software Fund is no longer in use. It has not been in use since 1993, and will no longer be used in the future.

Solution:

We recommend that the Department of Public Instruction present a request to the next legislature asking for the removal of this piece of legislation.
