Senator Karen Krebsbach, Chairman opens SB 2171. All senators present.

Senator Lyson, sponsor of SB 2171. He goes over bill and wants to express that he make sure that this bill does not refer or include legislators.

Representative Meier also acknowledges that she is a sponsor on the bill and is in support of this bill.

Chris Runge, Executive Director of the ND Public Employees Association testifies in support of SB 2171. She gets calls that time to time employees can not find a hotel for the \$45 fee and this would help incur the cost of these employees.

Senator Fairfield asks the question what is appropriate lodging?

C. Runge: I think for the most part state angelicas manage where their employees are staying and keep them in that amount, but say for example they have to stay over a Friday night and they are

not able to find a room for \$45 this would allow the agency to take on the cost and not the employee. These situations I believe don't happen a lot but, in certain cases can not be helped.

Senator Nelson: I am hoping there is some perimeters put-on this appropriate rate.

C. Runge: My main concern is that it does not come out of the pockets of these employees.

Senator Dever: What is to prevent hotels to not offer state rates when they can get more from this bill.

C. Runge: They get a tremendous amount of traffic from state employee rate, I would hope they would not do that.

Senator Brown: It did happen to legislators this season.

Senator Lyson; We wrote the bill to give the department heads some leeway and gives some pressure on those dept. heads to say if you are going to call a meeting get on the ball and get the rooms taken care of right away.

Bruce Conway, representing himself of a citizen, I think this gives the sate an opportunity to do its job better. You have to treat people in first class manner and this helps attract and retain first class personnel. I do not believe this will hurt the budgets.

Patti Lewis, North Dakota Hospitality Association, in support of SB 2171. States that this is a fairness issue it is nice to see that the employees will not have to incur this extra cost. But also, it is becoming very hard for hotels to bear the cost of \$45 in some circumstances. She understands Senator Dever's concerns and will help find a way to keep the bill alive but, feels competition will keep hotels in check.

Senator Nelson: I am leery of the state officer's and employees. We are state employees and so not want legislators included.

Senator Brown: you still need to meet your budget and it will come out the same just with less travel. The hotels would be cutting of their noses to spit their face to raise their price above the \$45.

Senator Krebsbach: I think the one catch is that the state head of the agency must authorize this.

Senator Fairfield: Can that head of the state agency delegate the authority of someone else?

Senator Brown: Generally speaking the CEO would sign the top two or three people and would authorize it.

Senator Brown: I think the bottom line is the budget.

Senator Wardner: I only think it would be used in situations were they are forced to stay at a more expensive rate. I don't see this used that often.

The committee turns this over to legislative council to amend this and to say that the state legislators are not included in this.
