Senator Herb Urlacher (mtr #1270) - Primary sponsor of this bill. Looking into the future, possibility of closing the Killdeer Airport. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 2178

Page 1, line 1, after "A BILL" replace the remainder of the bill with "for an Act to amend and reenact sections 2-06-02 and 2-06-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the dissolution of airport authorities.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 2-06-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

2-06-02. Creation of municipal airport authority - Dissolution.

- 1. Any municipality may, by resolution of its governing body, may create a public body corporate and politic to be known as a municipal airport authority, which is authorized to exercise its functions upon the appointment and qualification of the first commissioners thereof; or the governing body may by resolution may determine to exercise any or all powers granted to such authorities in this chapter until or unless such powers are or have been conferred upon a municipal or regional airport authority. Upon the adoption of a resolution creating a municipal airport authority, the governing body of the municipality shall, pursuant to the resolution, shall appoint five persons as commissioners of the authority. The commissioners who are first appointed are designated to serve for terms of one, two, three, four, and five years, respectively, but thereafter, each commissioner shall must be appointed for a term of five years, except that vacancies occurring otherwise than by expiration of term must be filled for the unexpired term by the governing body.
- After payment of all debts, a municipal airport authority may be dissolved by resolution of the governing body of the municipality. Before dissolution. the property of the airport authority either must be transferred to the municipality or sold.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 2-06-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

2-06-03. Creation of regional airport authority - Dissolution.

Two or more municipalities, whether in this state or in an adjoining state, provided that at least one municipality is in North Dakota, may by joint resolution, may create a public body, corporate and politic, to be known as a regional airport authority which is authorized to exercise its functions upon the issuance by the secretary of state of a certificate of incorporation. The governing bodies of the municipalities participating in the creation of a regional airport authority shall, pursuant to such joint resolution, shall appoint not less than at least five persons as commissioners of the regional airport authority. The number to be appointed and their representation must be provided for in the joint resolution. The term of office of each regional airport authority commissioner must be in accordance with subsection 5. Each such regional airport authority, once created, shall organize, elect officers for terms of office to be fixed by agreement, and adopt and amend from time to time rules for its own procedure not inconsistent with section 2-06-06.

- A regional airport authority may be decreased if each of the municipalities then included in the regional authority and the commissioners of the regional authority consent to the decrease and make provisions for the retention or disposition of its assets and liabilities; provided that, if the regional authority has any bonds outstanding no decrease may be effected unless one hundred per centum of the holders of the bonds consent thereto in writing.
- A municipality may not adopt any resolution authorized by this section without a public hearing therson. Notice thereof must be given at least ten days prior thereto in a newspaper published in the municipality, or if there is no newspaper published therein, then in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality.
- All commissioners of a regional airport authority must be appointed for terms of five years each, except that a vacancy occurring otherwise than by expiration of term shall must be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointments.
- After payment of all debts, a regional airport authority may be dissolved by a joint resolution of the governing bodies of the participating municipalities. Before dissolution, the property of the regional airport authority must be sold, transferred, or distributed as agreed by the participating municipalities. Any remaining funds of the regional airport authority must be distributed to the general funds of the participating municipalities in proportion to their support of the regional airport authority."

(6.5) CHAIRMAN GLEN FROSETH: We will open the hearing on SB 2178.

(7.0) SEN. HERB ERLACHER: What's brought this Bill about is a possibility of closing an airport at Killdeer. They discovered that they may have to pay back on the basis of the mill levy to each individual tax payor. That would complicate matters. Their idea was to be able to put those monies that are in there, leftovers, into their general fund, thereby reverting those monies back to the tax payors. The Attorney General's office could see where there was a lot of Agricultural language in the statutes. So they asked to incorporate the clarification of those statutes. She looked at a section in chapter 2, section 6, did not address whether or not an airport authority could even evolve. It did not clearly give them that authority. So she spoke with the Sen. and hog housed the Bill, adding language allowing for the dissolution of airport authorities. Also leaving in language addressing what happens to the money after it evolves. So that is why on the original Bill, it is in one section and now it is under chapter 20602 creation of municipal airport authority. And then section 2 is creation of regional airport authority and we've added dissolution to that. So now there is clear authority and if they need to dissolve, they can. The amendment made has no effect on Sen. Urlacher's intent. It still will address that the funds when municipal airports dissolve, the money will go back to the general fund of the county. In the case of a regional airport when more than one region contributed upon dissolution, this allows us to distribute the remaining funds in proportion to what the region put into it in the first place.
