Section 26.1-03-16 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that an insurance

company doing business in North Dakota which neglects to make and file any

statement within the time prescribed in the chapter forfeits \$100 for each day's

neglect upon notice by the commissioner to that effect and its authority to do new

business ceases during the default. The proposed amendment to this section

simply provides that the commissioner may grant an insurance company an

extension beyond the date designated in the section and may waive or reduce

any penalty during the extension upon a showing of good cause by the insurance

company.
