

CHAIRMAN COOK opened the hearing on SB 2208 relating to the meeting dates of city governing bodies. All senators (6) in attendance.

Jerry Hjelmstad, North Dakota League of Cities, testified in support of SB 2208. (See attached testimony)

CHAIRMAN COOK asked if Section 40-09-11 address 10 per cent of the cities that have the commission form of government.

Mr Hjelmstad, answered that was correct. These tend to be the larger cities and there is a pocket of smaller commission cities and they are primarily interested in being able to meet once a month rather than every two weeks. About one fourth of the cities in the state have home rule charters now and can modify this. The others can not change their meeting date unless this bill passes.

Mr. Chairman and members of the Senate Political Subdivisions Committee. my name is Jerry Hjelmstad and I am here on behalf of the North Dakota League of Cities to testify in support of Senate Bill No. 2208.

North Dakota's 358 incorporated cities are incorporated under 3 forms of government. About 90% of the cities are incorporated under the mayor-council form of government. Under this form, cities with a population of over 600 are divided into wards with council representation coming from each ward. The mayor does not vote except to break a tie. Under section 2 of this bill, these cities would be required to hold one council meeting per month, as established by local ordinance or resolution, but that meeting would no longer be required to be held "on or before the fifteenth day of the month".

About 10% of the cities are incorporated under the commission form of government. This form has five commissioners who are elected at large. One of the commissioners is the commission president who is commonly referred to as the mayor. Under section 3 of this bill, these cities would be required to hold one commission meeting per month rather than the current meeting requirement of once every two weeks. They could still establish additional meetings times by ordinance.

A few cities are incorporated under the modern council form of government. This form is basically a combination of the other two forms. A good example of a modern council city is the city of Wahpeton. They have eight council members and a mayor with council representatives from four wards and the mayor and four council members being elected at large. Under section 1 of this bill, modern council cities would be required to hold one council meeting per month, but that meeting would no longer be required to be held "on or before the fifteenth day of the month".

Senate Bill 2208 would still require monthly city governing board meetings, but it would eliminate unnecessary requirements as to when and how often these meetings would have to be held. We ask you to give a "do pass" recommendation to Senate Bill 2208.
