<u>Senator Thomas Fischer</u>, Chairman of the Senate Natural Resources Committee opened the hearing on SB 2227, relating to hunting by nonresident youth.

All committee members were present.

Senator Michael Every, District 23 sponsor of Bill 2227 presented the bill stating that he had presented a similar bill in 2001. The bill came about because of his life long friends who have come to North Dakota every year to hunt and who are now beginning to bring their sons.

Unfortunately they can only bring one son because it is cost prohibitive. It has also been brought to his attention by his constituents. Lets give the youth some wholesome fun and offer reciprocity to other states specifically Wisconsin. In visiting with sportsmen's groups, he is very encouraged by their response and he would be willing to support the idea of a nonresident youth buying a nonresident license at the youth price and it would apply to any cap for nonresident hunters.

Patty Lewis (2.2) representing the North Dakota Hospitality Association testified in support of SB 2227. She was brief and stated the passage of this bill would open many opportunities for the industry.

Kyle Blanchfield (2.9), President of the North Dakota Professional Guides & Outfitters testified in support of SB 2227. His organization is not looking at this bill with dollars signs, but thinks its just a healthy, smart thing to do to encourage youth to participate in water fowl hunting. His organization would continue to support the bill even if these licenses would count towards a nonresident cap.

Dennis Danei testified that he was not really opposed to SB 2227 but was more in a neutral position. He talked about the recent 9th Circuit Court's decision to uphold equal hunting rights for both resident and non resident hunters. His other comment was that if the state does not charge the nonresident fee for nonresident youth then the guides should not be able to charge hunting fee whether is by the gun or bag.

Harold Neameyer (6.0) representing the Cass County Wildlife Club testified in opposition to SB 2227 (See attached testimony). His overall comment for this bill was "if. 1 broke - don't fix it".

Mike Donahue (8.2) representing the United Sportsmen of North Dakota and the N.D. Wildlife Federation testified in opposition of SB 2227 (See attached testimony). He also stated that we should encourage other states who want reciprocity to do so in their state government.

<u>Senator John Traynor</u> asked if the number of youth is so little why are we bothering.

<u>Paul Schadewahl</u>, Chief of Administrative Services of North Dakota Sate Game & Fish

Paul Shadewald: It could be argued that way.

Rep. DeKrey: Pointed out the legal guardian part of the bill would cause trouble for someone to hunt with a family friend or some other group and recommended it be struck.

Rep. Drovdal: Minnesota for example could change their policy and our citizens would pay nonresident fees while we give them reciprocity.
