

Minutes: Chairman Keiser opened the hearing on SB 2229.

Senator Trenbeath, District 10, introduced the legislation and testified in support. "It's impossible to clear books within 15 days of an auction sale considering that consignment auctions involve transactions with individuals from at least three Canadian provinces and neighboring states".

Rep. Kasper: Have their been complaints regarding the 15 day limit?

Sen. Trenbeath: People tell me that the 15 day limit is openly ignored.

Rep. Ekstrom: Is the overstriking on line 13 purely a housekeeping measure?

Sen. Trenbeath: Yes.

Chairman Keiser: What's the penalty for this?

Sen. Trenbeath: Their license can be revoked.

Rep. Froseth: What's the normal procedure? A partial payment back to the owner?

Sen. Trenbeath: I don't know. I think that's to be negotiated between the seller and the auctioneer.

Rep. Kasper: Are there bonds to cover large amounts of money that people will be holding for thirty rather than fifteen days?

Sen. Trenbeath: There is a bond provision. Whether it's large enough to cover large sales or not, I'm not sure.

As there was no one else present to testify either in support of or in opposition to SB 2229, the hearing was closed.

Rep. Nottestad moved a Do Pass.

Rep. Thorpe seconded the motion.

The motion carried and the results of the roll call vote were: 14-0-0.


