<u>Senator Thomas Fischer</u>, Chairman of the Senate Natural Resources Committee opened the hearing on SB 2236 relating to the hunting of deer with muzzleloading firearms.

All members of the committee were present except Senator John Traynor.

Senator Ron Nichols from District 4 introduced SB 2236 stating that basically line 13 -17 of the bill explains the bill stating that an individual who obtains a license to hunt antiered white-tail deer during the regular deer hunting season may submit that license to the director and receive in exchange a special license to hunt antiered white-tailed deer with muzzleloading firearms during the muzzleloading firearm season in the unit for which the regular deer hunting season license was valid.

Harold Neameyer representing the Cass County Wildlife Club testified in support of SB 2236 (See attached testimony).

Mike Donahue representing the North Dakota Wildlife Federation testified in opposition to SB 2236 (See attached testimony).

<u>Dennis Daniel</u> testified that he was not really opposed to SB 2236, but was concerned about the safety issue. Muzzleloader guns are very accurate these days and maybe we should go back to the original muzzleloader before this bill is considered.

David Muntch testified that he is not really opposed to SB 2236 but agreed that the muzzleloader guns are very accurate and maybe this should be addressed in the bill.

Mike Donahue representing the United Sportsmen testified that the group is neutral on SB 2236 because they would need more information.

Paul Schadewald the Chief of Administrative Services Division of the North Dakota Game & Fish Department testified in a neutral position of SB 2236 stating they would intent for the exchange to be done before the start of the regular gun season. He also stated that these exchanged licenses would have to be in addition to the 2% of muzzleloading licenses already issued.

Senator Fischer closed the hearing on SB 2236.

TESTIMONY OF HAROLD NEAMEYER CASS COUNTY WILDLIFE CLUB

PRESENTED TO THE SENATE NATURAL RESOURCE COMMITTEE ON SB 2236, FEBRUARY 13, 2003

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

I am Harold Neameyer speaking on behalf of the Cass County Wildlife Club. The Cass County Wildlife Club supports SB 2236 based on the assumption that the exchange of the regular gun season license for a muzzleloader license takes place before the gun season starts. The intent of this bill to increase a muzzleloaders hunting of a whitetail buck seems acceptable. It may well lessen the pressure on the white tail bucks in the regular gun season.
