Mr. Chairman, member of the committee, my name is Linda Butts, director of the Economic Development and Finance Division of the North Dakota Department of Commerce.

This legislation has been introduced to put into statute the reality of how the Director of EDF relates to the Finance Office.

Current Fact Pattern of how the Finance Office and director of EDF relate

- EDF no longer has a deputy director
- That FTE was moved to create the position of Commission of Commerce
- The CEO of the Development Fund is the manager of the fund. This position is responsible for investments, contracts, and other transactions of the corporation.

This legislation moves the former responsibilities from the deputy to the director of EDF.
