SENATOR JUDY LEE opened the public hearing for SB 2291 relating to child abuse and neglect reporting requirements.

Roll call was read.

ARNOLD THOMAS of ND Healthcare Association testified in favor of the bill. Basically what it does is clarify language that permits all of the imagining and information that hospitals and medical professionals have available to be included in the whole business of dealing with the tough problem of child abuse. We had not received a tool from the Attorney General to include this paragraph or section as part of a broader bill, SB 2212. The bill was introduced and was scheduled for a hearing. We received permission after its introduction scheduled for a hearing. We have amended SB 2291 into SB 2212. We would ask that you kill this measure regarding child abuse. (Meter # 142 - 243)


