CHAIRMAN COOK called the committee to order.

CHAIRMAN COOK opened the hearing on SB 2320 relating to the powers of a city governing body.

SENATOR BROWN, District 27, Fargo ND introduced SB 2320 which relates to a city appropriating and disbursing funds for the establishment, maintenance and encouragement of the arts. This bill trys to answer a problem the city had when it passed some funds to a arts organization and then ending up being sued for the action. Urges a Do Pass for SB 2320 Connie Spryncznatyk, League of Cities, spoke in favor of SB 2320. They have been working with the bill sponsors to clarify a section of the general powers of cities. What they are recommending being done is that we make it clear that a city can appropriate and disburse city money and that we remove the language about matching funds, because nobody can figure out what that means.

Bill Wocken, City Administrator, City of Bismark, ND, spoke in favor of SB 2320 to add some clarity. The existing language in SB 2320 says that one of the cities powers is to accept and disburse money received from federal, state, county or private sources for the maintenance and encouragement of the arts with in the city. The reason that the language was changed is that the language on line nine and ten was becoming confusing. It will allow cities to disburse their own money in the way in which they like without having matching funds.

Mike Williams, Fargo ND feels the arts should try and raise their own funds and not become as dependent on city funds.

TAPE 1: SIDE A:

(20.4) CHAIRMAN GLEN FROSETH: We will open the hearing on SB 2320.

(21.6) CONNIE SPRYNCZYNATY; LEAGUE OF CITIES: There were some questions within the last year or so about what is the counties ability to make contribution to the Arts and in another case a home rule city. The League asked that this bill be introduced to clarify the section in state law under the municipal powers. This is an existing section under home rule with proper language in the home rule charter and implementing ordinance, there is no question about home rule city's being able to do it. The problem is that many of our state home rule charter's are limited to city sales tax in which case the charter does not contain that broad language. And that would probably not be considered an acceptable practice just because it's some confusion about this little section. And it has been in existence for some time. The old language has caused some discussion around people around this state wondering whether physical language says you have

to have a matching situation before you can contribute money, there was some language that frankly nobody could explain and we did a fair amount of research on it.

(23.3) REP. ANDREW MARAGOS: Does this have something to do with an event in Bismarck?

(23.4) CONNIE SPRYNCZYNATYK: You read the paper, don't you? Ha. The issue there is a companion bill that clarifies that a county may make the same sort of support for the Arts. The issue was the Symphony in this community sponsors the celebration of the 4th of July, and that includes the fireworks display and symphony. It's a great event but it was the Burleigh County contribution for that effort would vouch you're not a home rule charter county, counties don't have that in their power anyway. But then there was this language that sort of makes it unclear whether it's matching situation or just what happens. So there is a separate bill.

and 10, the overstruck language. That was the piece that I referred to as really confusing. Many city attorneys and certainly many commissions and councils, because it seems to no where and we contacted Legislative Council and we could not find why that was in place. The only explanation that we have is that a number of years ago the National Endowment for the Arts and the North Dakota Council on the Arts began offering through a matching grant program money to support local Arts. We think that may have been a piece of that activity. What we wanted to make clear was that the city may promise funds, the language that's added on line 6, the word "appropriate" and disburse city money. In other words, the city doesn't have to have received funds from someplace else. The city may distribute city money. It could be from sales tax or general fund. The reason the language was added regarding the 54-54-01 was because the Senate had some concerns that the support for the Arts be defined a bit. We contacted the North Dakota Council on the Arts to say how do you use the money that the State gives you towards the Arts, and that's why that section was added.

(27.9) REP. DALE SEVERSON: Let's say that Cooperstown has a large council. They receive money from Binford to give to the Arts Council. Can they do that because it's not appropriated by Cooperstown, it's given to them by Binford, so if you would strike that out does that mean that they can't receive it from other cities?

(28.5) CONNIE SPRYNCZYNATYK: We would not suggest that to be true. It says "disburse city moneys and to accept and disburse moneys received. If it were acceptable to the committee to either add that city back in or add local. I don't think it would harm the bill at all. It would be uncommon for cities to be passing money back and forth for local support for the Arts. In other words, transferring it to a city.

(29.6) REP. DALE SEVERSON: In rural North Dakota it may change a little bit, because they are going to start sharing purposes and because of all the necessities. Do they have to adjust it? (30.0) CONNIE SPRYNCZYNATYK: Usually if they are going to share services they have the joint power to do it.

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CHAPTER 54-54

COUNCIL ON THE ARTS

54-54-01. Legislative purpose and policy. It is the finding of the legislative assembly that many of our citizens lack the opportunity to view, enjoy, or participate in living theatrical performances, musical concerts, operas, dance and ballet recitals, art exhibits, examples of fine architecture, and the performing and fine arts generally. It is further found that, with increasing leisure time, the practice and enjoyment of the arts are of increasing importance and that the general welfare of the people of the state will be promoted by giving further recognition to the arts as a vital aspect of our culture and heritage and as a valued means of expanding the scope of our educational programs.

It is declared to be the policy of the state to join with private patrons and with institutions and professional organizations concerned with the arts to ensure that the role of the arts in the life of our communities will continue to grow and will play an evermore significant part in the welfare and educational experience of our citizens.

Ed.

I visited with City Attorney Charlie Whitman regarding these bills this afternoon. Charlie provided the draft language for SB 2320 so he was very familiar with the subject and the section of the code. The city would prefer SB 2320 over SB 2331.

SB 2320 was written specifically for cities in that it amends only the municipal powers portion of the NDCC. It clarifies that section in that, as it is currently written, there is confusion about whether or not a city can simply provide funding for the arts or can only do so as matching funds for another source. It amends item 75 in the list of powers of a city. It eliminates the reference to "city" on line 7 because the city wouldn't likely receive money from itself. Therefore the reference is unnecessary. The language deleted in lines 9 and 10 is unnecessary because in line 6 the city has the right to appropriate whether to provide match or principal funding. I have enclosed 40-38.1 dealing in depth with municipal arts councils for your reference.

SB 2331 is written for county needs. The county is not a party to NDCC 40-38.1 so it needs to affect a different section of the NDCC. The needs of the groups are different. We definitely prefer SB 2320. To put cities into SB 2331 would set up a potential and likely real conflict with NDCC 40-05-01 which is the subject of SB 2320 and with NDCC 40-38.1.
