Senator Thomas Fischer, Chairman of the Senate Natural Resources Committee opened the hearing on SB 2363 relating to deer hunting by nonresidents.

All members of the committee were present.

Senator Robert Erbele of District 28 introduced SB 2363 stating the bill attempts to address the over population of deer in select units where not all the tags are taken up. The bill would allow that after resident hunters have had all opportunities to receive tags, it would be opened to nonresident hunters at a reduced fee to help reduce the excess number of doe deer.

Senator Joel Heitkamn of District 26 cosponsor of SB 2363 testified that he recognized the problem of over population of doe and this would help to assure reducing of the number.

Jim Redlin from Ellendale, North Dakota testified in support, acknowledging the problem of

Curt Wells testified in support of SB 2363 stating a family member can come home and hunt even if they have did not pull a buck tag. A \$50.00 license is plenty for a doe.

Dennis Daniel testified in opposition upon certain principles of SB 2362. If in this bill a nonresident tag is reduced by 325% to \$50.00, then a resident license should also be dropped by the same percentage.

Mike Donahue of the United Sportsmen and the North Dakota Wildlife Federation testified that they were against the dollar amount set in the bill not the objective of SB 2363. They think it should be set at \$100.00 and a moderate reduction should be made on the second drawing for resident licenses.

David Mutsch testified that SB 2363 should set up a block management similar to the one in Montana.

Senator Fischer asked for neutral testimony.

Paul Schadewell, Chef of Administrative Services for the North Dakota Game & Fish

Department went over the fiscal note of SB 2363. In 2002, 561 nonresident licenses for a doc tag

were sold under the present fee, so more licenses might be sold but it might not off set revenue.

Senator Fischer closed the hearing on SB 2363.

Senator Thomas Fischer opended discussion on SB 2363.

Minutes: Chairman Holmberg opened the testimony to SB 2363. A bill relating to the deer hunting by nonresidents. Chairman Holmberg stated this bill comes to Appropriations with an unanimous vote from Natural Resources committee. (Meter 1481) Paul Schadewald, Game and Fish Department to explain the bill and the amendment: what the bill does is after the first drawing and second drawing, after the second drawing on the deer licenses there is a 1% limit on nonresidents and then they pay a \$155 for their deer license. After the first and second drawings it is opened up, nonresidents can have an unlimited license and only doe licenses are left. So what the sponsors have done here is wanting to reduce the fees from \$155 to \$50 and the Natural Resources committee changed it to \$100. So there would be a lower fee for nonresident deer licenses after the second drawing and that fee would be \$100. We sold about 561 licenses after the second drawing last time. (Meter 1589) Senator Mathern: Are we trying to get rid of deer? Is this a market issue? Does it help or not? (Meter 1603) Paul: It will help sell a few nonresident licenses but not a lot of nonresidents are going to come to hunt does. There could be a small
