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Minutes:

Senator Thomas Fischer, Chairman, brought the Natural Resources committee to order.

Attendance was taken indicating all members of the committee were present.

Secretor Fischer opened the hearing on SCR 4002, a resolution urging Congress to pay for depredation, personal injury damage, and property damage caused by elk that move from the Theodore Roosevelt National Park.

Representative Lois Delmore from District 43 serving as chairman of the Judiciary B - Natural Resources - Transportation Interim Committee presented SCR 4002. That committee studied the elk in the Theodore Roosevelt park and the possibilities of hunting the elk in the state instead of selling the elk. The resolution is very straight forward and urges Congress to compensate for damages done by the elk that often times escape the park.

Senator Freborg asked for clarification of "personal injury" on line 18 of the resolution.

Rep. Delmore explained that basically it was about automobile accidents and to get coverage for the damage that is caused from the large elks including physical injuries to people.

Senator Lyson asked if discussions had included damages caused to commercial elk farms.

Rep. Delmore responded that it was not particularly included in this study as there was no testimony as to the problem.

Senator Traynor explained some of the discussion of the interim committee including the different ideas of disposal of the elk. The first year a lot of animals died, so the Game & Fish arranged to transport the elks out of the state the next year. Hunters then asked for a hunting season in the park. It was then discovered that would take an act of congress. He further explained a case where an individual became permanently disabled due to a moose being hit by an auto. He felt if these large animals that are foreign to North Dakota are brought here by the National Park Service and they can be identified, why shouldn't the National government be responsible for the damage caused by these animals when they go outside of the confines of the park.

<u>Tim Dawson</u> of the North Dakota Legislative Council, testified neither for or against the bill but merely was present to explain the resolution. He explained the logic behind the "where as" clauses.

- 1. The federal government brought in the elk
- 2. The elk herd has grown to large
- 3. When there is to many elk it results in them leaving the park
- 4. When they leave the park they cause property depredation

5. Elk may cause auto accidents

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6. The elk can be identified so they can be traced back as the source of damage

The resolution clause says the Federal Government should pay for these damages.

Wade Moser representing the ND Stockmen's Association, testified in support of the resolution, stating if nothing else this would make aware the problems caused by the mismanagement of the park by not keeping the number of elk in line.

Mike Donahue representing the ND Wildlife Federation and United Sportsmen of ND testified that these two organizations supported the resolution.

Brian Kramer representing the ND Farm Bureau testified the organization supported the resolution.

Senator Heitkamp asked if there was any commercial elk ranches near the park causing the elk to leave the park.

Senator Fischer answered that he was not made aware of any but that he has concerns of the inability of the park service to able to transport the elk out of state because of the cronic wasting problem.

Senator Fischer asked for any testimony in opposition of the resolution.

Senator Fischer asked for any neutral testimony.

Bill Pflefer representing the Wildlife Society testified or asked if further efforts could be made for a congressional approved hunt in the park.

Senator Traynor answered that park hunt was the first choice of the interim committee, but found out that not only the park service but the environmentalists would oppose it and would get no where.

Mike Donahue wanted to add that his organizations the ND Wildlife Federation and the United

Sportsmen's of ND are in favor of a park hunt.

Senator Fischer closed the hearing on SCR 4002.

Minutes:

Chair Nelson called the hearing on SCR 4002 A concurrent resolution urging Congress to pay for depredation, personal injury damage, and property damage caused by elk that move from the Theodore Roosevelt National Park to order.

Rep. Delmore: Introduced HCR 4002 as chair of Judiciary B committee.

Tim Dawson: Provided a Legislative Council description of the HCR.

Rep. Keiser: Did we have any say in the growth of the elk population?

Rep. Hanson: Dale Hettinger ND Game and Fish Department requested the elk be brought in.

Rep. DeKrey: Why should we send bill to the federal government that we ourselves will not

pass.

Chair Nelson: There is no provision for a hunting season in the park. There is some interest in a

bow season. That requires an act of Congress. We are trying to stimulate some awareness that

there is a problem. The fences are not repaired in a timely manner. Some ranchers have sever depredation problems.

Rep. Nottestad: How much discussion was made of the buffalo plans Wyoming implements to handle escapes from there areas?

Tim Dawson: There was some interest in opening hunting in those areas.

Chair Nelson: The local ranchers have not seemed to interested in that.

Rep. Hanson: This will open up a can of worms in all the national parks.

Dean Hildebrand: Director of Game and Fish Department. Testified on the problems associated with the elk and techniques to deal with them. The Game and Fish have had four hunts to try and mitigate the problem.

Rep. Drovdal: Commented on the Problems of Chronic wasting disease.

Dean Hildebrand: Testified there are no current cases of the disease in North Dakota.

However there has been some testing on the subject.

David Munch: Testified in opposition to HCR 4002. Expressed concern over antagonizing the park service.

Chair Nelson closes the hearing on SCR 4002.

Chair Nelson: The point of this resolution is to tell the park service that they cannot walk away from the problem.

Rep. Drovdal: Pointed out that it is a small park and an overpopulation of deer and elk.

Chair Nelson: The park service accuses ranchers of planting "lure crops" when in fact they are trying to merrily feed there cattle.

Rep. Porter: Agreed that the park service has not North Dakota any favors in this instance, however there is little chance that the resolution will achieve anything.

Rep. Porter proposed an amendment to require certified mail and a receipt on the resolution so the park service will see it. Rep. DeKrey seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote.

Rep. Norland moved a Do Not Pass on SCR 4002 seconded by Porter. The motion failed by a vote of 5-9-0.

Rep. Porter motioned a Do Pass with Amendments on SCR 4002. Rep. DeKrey seconded the motion. The motion carried by a voice vote of 9-5-0. Rep. Drovdal will carry.
