If we go into extended session I want it to cost the state of ND as little as possible. We can coordinate and manage a more logical process with this legislature to put forward a more logical process.

Delzer** what if a legislator is not a member of the meeting committee, but for his district there is a need to be there. I don't see a way for someone having a legitimate reason to be there to get paid.

Rep. Berg I can open to suggestions, I want the people that need to be there to be able to be there.

John Olsrud, Director, Legislative Council The sunset, this is a policy decision for you to make it was drafted to only apply to this session. I'm not sure it that was the intent. If this should apply to future sessions, the sunset should be removed. If you adjourn for 2 weeks, under law you would be entitled to \$125/day during that time until you adjourn Sine Die. Minutes: CHAIRMAN HOLMBERG opened the hearing of the special session to HB 1507. A bill relating to compensation and expense reimbursement of members of the legislative assembly. (Meter 389) ALLEN KNUDSON, Legislative Council, explained the changes that the bill and amendment (30800.0302) from the House included. The intent was to provide for the legislative compensation during the special session. The concern of the sponsors were that if the special session would adjourn for a couple of days, then the current law, the legislators would continue to get paid for those days even though they are not here. So a section was added on page 2, that legislators would be paid only for the days they are here, or for a standing committee meeting or if the majority/minority leaders approved attendance. It does have an expiration date for this special session. The House in the amendments removed the expiration dates so this would be part of permanent law and would be in effect for future special sessions as well, The language was changed to provide that if during the special session, if the legislative assembly adjourns for more that three days, then the member would receive compensation only for those day the member was

in attendance in committee meetings. If a legislator that was not a member of a standing committee that was meeting and they wanted to attend those meeting, they would not be paid under the original bill, this would provide that if the member can get paid by the approval of the majority/minority leader. If a special session would go over a weekend, the legislators under the original bill would not get paid, where now if only they adjourn for more than three days would not get paid, this would cover it.

(Meter 596) CHAIRMAN HOLMBERG stated as he understood it, was the rationale was that during a special session, it was determined to adjourn and come back at a later date like 15 days later, that legislators under current law would be paid for that 15 days, even though they would not be here. With this bill, during a special session, if we recess or adjourn, we are not going to be paid if you are gone for more than three days.

(Meter 744) SENATOR ANDRIST stated he is uncomfortable if he understands this. If this special session would carry over to Monday, that they would get paid for Saturday and Sunday. **CHAIRMAN HOLMBERG** stated that is current law and that is what happens during session. (Meter 787) SENATOR MATHERN stated that he feels this seems to imply that they will come back for another session. He feels the same, if we can recess not adjourn and can come back and everything is still in place and get paid and not call a special session.

(Meter 913) ALLEN KNUDSON clarified that the Legislative Council can call the legislative session into session in the current law. There was discussion that if for example, the Governor would veto any bill passed in the special session, if the legislature was called back into a special session, again the bill would to be reintroduced and go through both Houses. With this mechanism in place, if the legislature was to adjourn to a date certain, and the Governor would

veto a bill, the legislature could come back in that same special session and vote to override the Governor's veto.

(Meter 995) SENATOR MATHERN asked what is the date in here that this bill states we adjourn to? ALLEN KNUDSON responded this bill does not speak to that, it only deals with legislative compensation.

(Meter 1023) CHAIRMAN HOLMBERG stated that this bill does not set up a date when to come back. It only states that if there is a motion to do that, then it is unseemly to be paid for the days they are not here. This bill would make sure that no one would get paid during the interim. More discussion of examples of whether the body would adjourn or sine die continued. (Meter 1253) CHAIRMAN HOLMBERG stated that this gives the legislature more options in unusual cases.

(Meter 1289) There was a motion of a DO PASS by SENATOR KRINGSTAD and seconded by **SENATOR THANE**. A roll call vote of 7 yeas, 5 nays, 2 absent and not voting **passed** the bill.

SENATOR GRINDBERG will carry the bill to the floor.
