Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, February 28, 2003

The Senate convened at 12:30 p.m., with President Dalrymple presiding.

The prayer was offered by Reverend Dale V. Nabben, Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senator Polovitz.

A quorum was declared by the President.

REMARKS OF SENATOR TRENBEATH REGARDING EVERETT C. ALBERS

I rise this afternoon to acquaint this body with a great North Dakotan and a fine human being: Everett C. Albers, known to those of us who are more than casual acquaintances as "Ev".

Thirty years ago, on the advent of the National Endowment for the Humanities, the North Dakota Humanities Council was formed as a partner of the Endowment. Its first executive director was Ev Albers. Now, on the thirtieth anniversary of the organization, Ev remain at its helm, the longest serving executive director in the United States. Although 30 years on the job, Ev has never allowed the Humanities Council to stagnate or rust, gathering neither moss nor barnacle. It remains committed to bringing the humanities to the citizens of North Dakota - whether it be through lectures by Larry Remele Memorial Fellows, humanities programming grants in small towns, Smithsonian Institution Museum on Main Street (MOMS) travelling exhibits, or engaging groups throughout the state in a National Conversation about who we, as the upstart democracy of the world, started out to be and have become.

Certainly Ev has been the prime mover in all these areas and so many more. On a national scale, also, Ev is recognized for his outstanding service to the humanities. He is the father of the modern Great Plains Chautauqua, a revival of the nineteenth century tented, travelling oratorical events involving humanities scholars from throughout the plains states, appearing in the character of historical figures; allowing, for instance, the oration of and later discussion with Andrew Carnegie or Theodore Roosevelt.

Above all else, Ev has spent thirty years being an unassuming, unabrasive, tactful consensus builder; always shunning credit in favor of another in order to accomplish the goal. After all, he works with 15 people, all volunteers, from every part of the state - Kindred to Noonan; Cavalier to Dickinson. From University professor to grade school teacher; organic farmer to recovering attorney; flaming liberal to icy conservative. I can think of no more diverse or challenging group from which to squeeze consensus. Yet Ev Albers makes us one.

Ev, as you might imagine, is a voracious reader and probably his favorite poet is Thomas McGarth, whom Everett refers to as "North Dakota's Gift to the Millennia". As such I will close with the McGrath lines with which Ev has closed all of his recent correspondence:

How could I have come so far?
(And always on such dark trails!)
I must have travelled by the light
Shining from the faces of all those I have loved.

Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, please join the North Dakota Humanities Council, as it celebrates its Thirtieth Anniversary, by honoring Everett C. Albers with your Congratulatory Resolution.
