This bill changes the fees due to acquire a veteran's cemetery license plate and the distribution of the funds collected. The bill redirects \$5 annually that previously went to the highway tax distribution fund into the veteran's cemetery maintenance fund. It is estimated this will generate an additional \$22,000 for the maintenance fund. The bill also provides for a one-time fee of \$9 to cover the cost of manufacturing the special license plates. It is estimated the \$9 license plate fee will cover the cost of manufacturing the special license plates.
