This bill creates a new section to chapter 54-09 because the sentence on page 2, beginning at line 15 and ending on line 18 currently counteracts the provisions in the sentence beginning on line 26. Because it did, the Secretary of State's office was forced to charge a fee to other agencies, in those rare situations where they needed information that was filed in the Secretary of State's Central Indexing System. However, these charges are contrary to the intent in line 15 whereby agencies are not to be charged. By creating a new section in chapter 54-09, the agencies and others will be exempted from those charges for information filed in the Central Indexing System. The end-result is, that in the big budget picture, the change is revenue and expense neutral because another agency will not have to pay the Secretary of State's office from that agency's general fund for information, which payment is just deposited back into the general fund by the Secretary of State.
