ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2339

1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the interstate transfer or travel of probationers; to provide for a
2 continuing appropriation; and to provide an appropriation.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. Interstate transfer or travel of probationers - Fees - Continuing**
5 **appropriation.**

- 6 1. Upon the approval by the department of corrections and rehabilitation of a request
7 of a probationer who is under the supervision of the department of corrections and
8 rehabilitation to transfer residence to another state under the interstate compact for
9 adult offender supervision, the probationer shall pay to the department an
10 application fee of one hundred fifty dollars. The department may waive the
11 offender's application fee. If the department waives the offender's payment of the
12 fee, the department shall pay the offender's application fee. In addition to the
13 application fee paid by the probationer or the department, the county having
14 jurisdiction over the probationer, upon approval of the application for transfer, shall
15 pay to the department a fee of one hundred fifty dollars.
- 16 2. Any probationer residing in the state who requests a travel permit to travel to
17 another state shall pay to the department a travel permit fee in accordance with fee
18 schedules established by the department. In the case of illness or death in the
19 probationer's family, the department may waive the travel permit fee for hardship.
- 20 3. The department shall transfer all funds collected or paid under this section to the
21 state treasury for deposit in the probationer violation transportation fund. The
22 funds deposited in this fund are appropriated to the department on a continuing
23 basis for the purpose of defraying the costs of returning to the state probationers

1 who violate their conditions of supervision. The department may contract with a
2 private entity to assist in the administration of the fund.

3 4. The department shall adopt rules for implementation of this section.

4 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the
5 probationer violation transportation fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$165,000, or
6 so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation
7 for the purpose of defraying the costs of returning to the state probationers who violate their
8 conditions of supervision, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
